- 5 (1) <u>"Family caregiver long-term care information and support</u> services" means providing long-term care information and support 6 services to unpaid family and other unpaid caregivers of adults with 7 8 functional disabilities, including but not limited to providing: (a) 9 Information about available public and private long-term care support 10 services; (b) assistance in gaining access to an array of appropriate long-term care family caregiver services; (c) promotion and 11 implementation of support groups; (d) caregiver training to assist the 12 nonpaid caregivers in making decisions and solving challenges relating 13 to their caregiving roles; (e) respite care services; and (f) 14 15 additional supportive long-term care services that may include but not be limited to translating/interpreter services, specialized 16 transportation, coordination of health care services, help purchasing 17 needed supplies, durable goods, or equipment, and other forms of 18 19 information and support necessary to maintain the unpaid caregiving 20 activity.
