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- 5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 6 following:
- 7 Sec. 1. The legislature finds that state and "NEW SECTION. 8 national goals are to use maximum efforts to protect and restore 9 surface waters so that they are swimmable and fishable. Recreational 10 use of public waters is an important part of the lives of Washington citizens, yet individuals as well as governmental agencies each have a 11 12 responsibility to use judgment and to take action to minimize health 13 risks from such recreational use. Therefore, it is the intent of the legislature that state and local public health officials increase their 14 15 efforts in reviewing water quality information that indicates an elevated health risk for direct contact recreational use. 16 17 further the intent of the legislature that the appropriate health officials take action to inform the public when surface waters 18 19 frequently used for recreation pose elevated risks to public health. 20 The notification tools which should be considered include posting signs at public access points, mailing, and public service announcements in 21 22 print and electronic media.
- 23 Sec. 2. (1) The department of health, NEW SECTION. 24 consultation with jurisdictional health departments and the department 25 of ecology, may recommend to the board of health a model program for public health standards for surface waters. The program adopted by the 26 27 be implemented by the department of board shall health and 28 jurisdictional health departments.
- 29 (2) The components of the model program shall include, but shall 30 not be limited to:
- 31 (a) Facilitating state agencies, local governments, and citizens 32 that conduct surface water quality monitoring in providing notice to 33 local health jurisdictions when public health standards are exceeded;
- 34 (b) Identification and establishment of public health threshold 35 standards for surface waters. The threshold standards shall be based

- on specific bacterial and other pollutant parameters and surveys as 1
- 2 well as monitoring information regarding pollution loading in surface
- 3 waters;
- 4 (c) Guidance for identifying and inventorying surface waters 5 subject to frequent use for recreation by the public;
- (d) Guidance for local health departments to respond to information 6 7 about contamination;
- 8 (e) Guidance on public information resources to employ when a threat to public health is identified, such as posting of water 9 10 identified as posing a risk to public health, public service announcements through print and electronic media, or other public
- 11
- notification measures; and 12
- (f) Guidance for conducting public education activities relating to 13
- safe recreational use of surface waters and which may include 14
- 15 information regarding common sources of bacterial contamination to
- waters frequently used for recreational activities. 16
- 17 (3) The model program shall be submitted to the board of health by
- December 1, 2000, and the board shall adopt a program through rules by 18
- 19 June 1, 2001."
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- On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "monitoring;" strike the 23
- 24 remainder of the title and insert "and creating new sections."

EFFECT: Directs the board of health to adopt a model program for public health standards for surface waters. The model program shall also be adopted by the department of health and local health departments.

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
