- 7 "WHEREAS, The Higher Education Coordinating Board is charged with 8 the duty of preparing a comprehensive master plan for higher education 9 in this state; and
- WHEREAS, The state master plan for higher education sets a goal for 10 11 increasing enrollment in postsecondary education by the year 2010 and the year 2020. The goal is to increase lower-division enrollment at 12 13 the rate of population growth, and upper-division and graduate 14 enrollments to the national average participation rate by the year 2010 15 and the national 70th percentile participation rate by the year 2020. 16 To meet these enrollment goals, 59,000 new full-time equivalent 17 students will enter the system by the year 2010 and 92,000 by the year 18 2020; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Governor's 2020 Commission on the future of 20 postsecondary education recommended increasing the higher education 21 enrollment goal to better respond to the growing demands of a 22 knowledge-based economy and challenged the state to find creative 23 solutions to serve the growing number of people without building new 24 college campuses; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The legislature has a responsibility to preserve and 26 maintain the existing investment in higher education capital assets 27 while balancing the need for new facilities to meet the growing student 28 enrollment levels; and
- WHEREAS, The legislature must evaluate the policy, financial, and facility implications of the higher enrollment goals for higher education;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of the state of Washington, the Senate concurring, That a joint select committee on the future facility needs of higher education be established to review the proposed higher education enrollment levels in the state master plan, review the facility needs for future

1 students, and review the funding options for additional higher 2 education facilities in the state; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee consist of eight members, four members each selected by the President of the Senate and the Co-Speakers of the House of Representatives and that the committee be represented by a member from the House Capital Budget Committee, House Appropriations Committee, House Higher Education Committee, Senate Ways and Means Committee, and Senate Higher Education Committee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and recommendations to the legislature at the regular session held in 2001."
