6 On page 2, line 16, strike "and"

7 On page 2, line 19, after "grade" insert "; or (iv) students
8 graduating from public high school, approved private high schools under
9 chapter 28A.195 RCW and students participating in home-based
10 instruction as provided in chapter 28A.200 RCW must equal or exceed a
11 cumulative Scholastic Achievement Test score of 1200 on their first
12 attempt"

13 On page 2, line 24, after "grade" insert "or those students who on
14 their first attempt during their high school years achieve a cumulative
15 Scholastic Achievement Test state percentile ranking equivalent to or
16 above the corresponding percentage of students that passed the
17 certificate of mastery. This determination shall be made by the
18 superintendent of public instruction who shall provide the methodology
19 by which the determination is made"

20 On page 4, line 11, after "year" insert "including the names,
21 addresses, and birth dates of other eligible students who have met the
22 requirements described in section 2 of this act"

23 On page 4, line 16, after "attempt" insert "including the names,
24 addresses, and birth dates of other eligible students who have met the
25 requirements described in section 2 of this act "

26 On page 5, after line 12 insert the following:

27 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7.** The provisions of chapter ..., Laws of 2000
28 (this act) shall not be construed to change current state requirements
29 for students who received home-based instruction under chapter 28A.200
30 RCW."

31 On page 6, line 20, strike "6" and insert "7"

1 Renumber the sections consecutively and correct any internal
2 references accordingly.

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EFFECT: Adds options other than the Washington Assessment of Student Learning and Certificate of Mastery exams for all high school students based on the Scholastic Aptitude Test administered to high school students intending to attend college.

Requires the OSPI to forward all the eligible names to the HECB.

Clarifies the existing exemptions granted to home-schooled children.
