Authorizing general contractor/construction manager contracting procedures for school district capital projects

### BACKGROUND:

1) Standard procedures award contracts for public works projects.

Different procedures established at agencies and various government award contracts for public works projects.

Frequently different procedures have been established at agencies and local governments to award public works contracts depending on the estimated cost of the project with varying requirements as follows:

- An agency or local government may award contracts for public work projects on a relative estimated basis in many manner it chooses.
- An agency or local government may award contracts using small works of bidding process award contracts projects up to a medium estimate. Under this process limited number of contractors are contacted and asked to submit bids. The contract is awarded to the lowest responsible bidder.
- An agency or local government may award contracts using formal bidding process normally award contracts of highest estimated value where notices published question and answer period sealed and open a designated place. The contract is awarded to the lowest responsible bidder.

## 2. Alternative works contracting procedure.

Several different agencies and local governments have authorized alternative public works contracting procedures toward contracts in public works contracts of very large dollar value. One alternative procedure is the design-build. Another alternative procedure is the general contractor/consignee procedure. Authority of the alternative procedures terminates July 1, 2001. A temporary independent oversight committee created to review the alternative bidding procedures and recommend changes to contracting to the legislature.

The general contractor/consignee procedure involves the following steps:

- Publishing notice announcing the procedure will be used with opportunity for public comments.
- Publishing notice calling for bids that include a description of the process and relative weight of factors that will be used to evaluate proposals.
- Creating a committee to evaluate proposals that uses a process selected between three and five finalists by submitting proposals that include a fixed fee for (1) The percentage amount the project that the general contractor/manager will take over head and profit and (2) the fixed amount for the details specific general conditions.
- Scoring the final bids proposals that are submitted that measure quality and technical merit as a unit prior to selecting the final bid based on responsiveness and lowest price among those final viable products and specifications meeting project requirements.
- Directly negotiating with the selected contractor to establish a maximum allowable discount. Negotiations determined with the selected contractor for an agreement not reached and opened with the highest bid amount. An agreement is reached the process terminated.
- Contract or subcontract awarded to the responsible bidder submitting the lowest responsive.

The Department of General Administration, University of Washington, Washington State University, county with population greater than 450,000 King, Pierce and

Snohomish County, every with population excess of 150,000; Seattle, The City and Spokane, both districts with population excess of 500,000; Port Seattle and Port of Tacoma and public facilities districts structure base bid may use the general contractor/consolidated process any project with an estimated cost of \$10 million or more. In addition, some also use the general contractor/consolidated process several demonstration projects between \$3 million and \$10 million estimated.

## **SUMMARY:**

School districts allow to use the general contractor/consolidated process award contracts for public works projects excess of \$10 million that are approved by the school district review board. In addition, school districts can award day labor contracts to award by school districts the general contractor/consolidated process up to five demonstration projects with an estimated cost between \$5 million and \$10 million. A school district may use this process more than one demonstration project as a variety of factors set including consideration of the overall demand of the demonstration projects.

The school district review board is established by the school district of the general contractor/consolidated process awarding contract for public works project. The board consists of eight persons selected by the independent oversight committee and consists of one representative from each of the following units: 1) The Office of the Superintendent, 2) the Office of Financial Management, 3) the construction industry, 4) the specialty contracting industry, 5) the design industry, 6) a public body that has used the alternative bidding procedures, 7) school districts with 10,000 or more annual average full-time equivalent students and 8) school districts with less than 10,000 or more annual average full-time equivalent students.

A variety of factors are established by the school district review board to authorize school districts to use the general contractor/consolidated process, including construction and an explanation of the use of this process in the public interest. The school district review board must prepare a report reviewing the districts of this process.
