### **BACKGROUND:**

The State Toxicology was established in conjunction with the University of Washington Medical School and under the authority of the State Forensic Investigations. The state toxicology is split by the State Forensic Investigations and the university and controls toxicology.

The lab performs toxicological add requests to all coroner medical examinations and prosecuting attorney. The lab currently has no disbursement funds for services to restaurants, service private landsports, entertainment facilities, and other.

The crime lab is under the authority of the State Forensic Investigations and is housed within the Washington State Patrol. The crime lab provides laboratory services, analyzed scientific and physical evidence related to any crime.

The Forensic Investigations is actively involved in preparing the budgets both the crime and toxicology and approves the budget prior to the formal submission to the Office of Financial Management.

### **SUMMARY:**

All powers and functions of employees of the State Toxicology are transferred to the Bureau of Forensic Laboratory Services of the Washington State Patrol.

The Bureau of Forensic Laboratory Services created within the Washington State Patrol which combines toxicology, crime scene, and bureaus and provides services of the two labs.

The Forensic Investigations will be involved in assisting in preparation of the budget and must approve the budget in formal submission to the Office of Financial Management.

The Forensic Investigations will prescribe the qualifications of directors and submit three names

to the chief of the Washington State Patrol, as director of the Bureau of Forensic Services. The council will further appoint a state toxicologist, establish policies, objectives and priorities for the Bureau of Forensic Investigative Services.
