Updating state printing laws.

BACKGROUND:

The Governor is required to appoint a state printer.

Printing binding required by state agencies must be done by the state printer except for printing for the supreme court and appeals and institutions of education. The printing of certificates or bonds offering close statements, educational publications, historical, etc. However, state agencies do their own printing if they have the equipment and may do printing for the state agencies. On a part of a course of study relating to the profession of printing, additional printing and binding may be done by an institution or agency of the Department of Social and Health Services in Olympia may be done directly by a private company if the cost does not exceed \$1000 as periodically adjusted for inflation.

Institutions of education consult with the state printer to develop procedures for selection of those to be supplied by the state printer for printing jobs.

Printing and the work done is supplied by the state printer for various state agencies. It is paid in accordance with standards fixed by the state printer and maintained by the state printer. It may even pay charges exceeding those published by the Porte Publishing Company Frank Print Catalog or similar comparable.

The state printer may secure printing, binding, supplies from private sources. The state printer determines whether to be secured from private sources is economically by doing the work preparing supplies for the state printer. If this printing supplied is obtained from private sources, the state printer shall add five percent to the bill. It is charged for handling costs but not for contracts with state institutions of education.

The state printer is furnished paper, stock and binding material required for public work other than public work provided by institutions of education and charged at actual plus five percent for

waste storage, insurance and handling.

SUMMARY:

State agencies that the legislature no longer required to have the printing and binding of the state print institutions, the education and the state agencies, contract with the state printer or any private company for printing and binding work using a general selection procedure that is similar to those the state printer develops for contracting for printing and binding work.

There requirement is deleted as it supersedes the state printer's right to be paid for an actual cost basis. The five percent markup on paper and stock supplied by the state printer long applies.

Whenever state agencies contract for printing and binding supplies the state printer, the state printer may secure this work and materials from a private source. The five percent handling charge work and work that is contracted does not apply to contracts made by a state agency with its own private printing company.
