### **BACKGROUND:**

Legislation enacted in 1933 ended Prohibition statewide, establishing laws regulating liquor.

The Liquor Control Board was established as a three-member board that collects, regulates, and administers state liquor laws, including:

- The general management and supervision of state liquor stores and the board's monopoly liquor operations;
- The authority to adopt rules controlling liquor;
- The authority to hear appeals from actions taken by the board.

Members of the board are appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Senate, serving staggered four-year terms of office and serving on a full-time basis.

### **SUMMARY:**

The nature of the Liquor Control Board is altered so it regulates and administers liquor over a two-year period before becoming a regulatory authority with administrative responsibilities. The Department of Liquor Control is established and during its two-year period assumes the board's administrative responsibilities and administration of the state's liquor operations. The department administrator is directly appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the Governor.

#### 1. Transition.

The Liquor Control Board continues to administer the state's liquor operations during transition

period which commences on the ninth day after journymen end on July, 2001. However the chair of the Board gives the addressee responsibility for a full transcription than the Board itself.

The board remains a full-body during the transcription period.

Commencing on July, 2001 the Liquor Control Board does its administrative work retains the authority to establish and hear appeals. The Board becomes part-time at that time with its members receiving compensation at a per diem rate of \$100.

The Department of Liquor Control established July, 2001 to assume the administrative responsibilities of the Liquor Control Board and administer the state's laws and operations. Governor appoints director of the department who is the executive head of the department. The director subject to confirmation by the Senate serves at the pleasure of the Governor. All administrative powers and functions of the Liquor Control Board are transferred to the director. The director supervises and administers the operation of the department, employs personnel following state civil service laws, appoints assistants, inspectors, specialists, statisticians, contractors, advisory committees and delegates powers to employees. A number of statutory regulations, specific administrative actions of the board are amended to provide that the director of the department make those sections.

The director is required to adopt an integration plan that includes a number of items including programmatic efficiency programs, public consumption information, emphasis on health and disease prevention, responsible consumption strategy, implementation plan.

The Code Revision is directed to prepare and present before the 2000 legislature correct references to the Liquor Control Board that are rendered inaccurate by this legislation.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** Ninety days after the session which it is passed.
