- 1 AN ACT Relating to sales and use tax exemptions for corrective
- 2 lenses; amending RCW 82.08.0281 and 82.12.0275; adding a new section to

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 82.08 RCW
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 The tax levied by RCW 82.08.020 does not apply to sales of
- 9 corrective lenses, frames for corrective lenses, or the components
- 10 thereof. In addition, the tax levied by RCW 82.08.020 does not apply
- 11 to charges made for labor and services rendered in respect to the
- 12 repairing, cleaning, altering, or improving of any of the items
- 13 exempted under this section. For purposes of this section, "corrective
- 14 lens" means any lens, including a contact lens, intended to aid or
- 15 correct visual defects or anomalies of humans.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 82.12 RCW
