- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. The legislature finds that some private NEW SECTION. 5 sector companies that generate carbon dioxide emissions or manufacture products that emit carbon dioxide, have begun purchasing carbon credits 6 from landowners and other companies that have invested in energy efficiency retrofits. The companies that are purchasing these credits 8 recognize that the development of a market or trading program for these 9 10 credits would be beneficial. Forests are one of the most effective long-term resources able to absorb carbon dioxide. These forests are 11 known to provide "carbon storage" or "carbon sinks." 12 13 Washington contains some of the most productive forests worldwide, 14 nonindustrial private forest landowners could greatly benefit from the 15 establishment of a formally recognized carbon storage trading program. Marketing forest land for carbon storage could provide additional 16 17 revenue to nonindustrial forest landowners and this could act as an incentive to maintain the land base in long-term forest production. 18

- 8 (1) The committee shall consist of:
- 9 (a) One member from each of the two largest caucuses of the senate,
- 10 selected by the president of the senate;
- 11 (b) One representative from each of the two largest caucuses of the
- 12 house of representatives, selected by the co-speakers of the house of
- 13 representatives;

- 14 (c) One person from the college of forest resources of the
- 15 University of Washington;
 - (d) One person representing the timber industry;
- 17 (e) One person representing local government;
- 18 (f) One person representing environmental interests;
- 19 (g) One person representing tribal interests;
- 20 (h) One person representing state agencies; and
- 21 (i) One person representing farm forestry.
- 22 (2) The committee shall prepare a report to the legislature by
- 23 December 15, 1999, that includes:
- 24 (a) A report on carbon sequestration activities that could earn
- 25 credits and receive payment for mitigation of carbon released to the
- 26 atmosphere;
- 27 (b) Recommendations for a system to register trades;
- 28 (c) An estimate of the current carbon storage capacity in the
- 29 state;
- 30 (d) An estimate of the carbon storage capacity increases available
- 31 through varying management regimes;
- 32 (e) Standards and protocols necessary to ensure that proposed
- 33 carbon sequestration projects meet a mandatory eligibility and emission
- 34 reduction criteria;
- 35 (f) Procedures to allow for the measurement, verification, and
- 36 tracking of proposed carbon sequestration projects; and
- 37 (g) Two pilot projects designed to implement the committee
- 38 recommendations.

1 (3) The sum of one hundred thousand dollars, or as much thereof as 2 may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 3 2001, from the general fund to the department of natural resources for 4 the purpose of preparing the report on the Washington state carbon 5 sequestration implementation and certification plan.
