- 1 AN ACT Relating to the homicide information tracking system of the
- 2 office of the attorney general; adding a new section to chapter 43.10
- 3 RCW; and making appropriations.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.10 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 The legislature finds that the dissemination of meaningful and
- 8 accurate data on serious crimes to the appropriate law enforcement
- 9 agencies is beneficial to public safety in the state. The homicide
- 10 information tracking system program within the criminal litigation
- 11 division of the office of the attorney general has provided useful and
- 12 timely information on murder and rape cases to law enforcement
- 13 officials in the state, especially regarding multiple offenders.
- 14 Because robbery is often a crime that accompanies murders and rapes,
- 15 investigation of violent crime would be facilitated by the monitoring
- 16 of robberies. Integrating the collection, compilation, and analysis of
- 17 robbery data into the homicide information tracking system would
- 18 eliminate the need to develop a parallel process. The combination of
- 19 major criminal data into one data base and analysis tool will result in

- 1 greater interagency information sharing and ultimately in more 2 efficient criminal investigations.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The sum of two hundred sixty-one thousand dollars for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, and the sum of one 4 hundred ninety-three thousand dollars for the fiscal year ending June 5 30, 2001, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated from 6 7 the general fund to the office of the attorney general. The amounts in 8 this section are provided solely to expand the homicide information tracking system to include collection, compilation, and analysis of 9 robberies. 10
