1 AN ACT Relating to educational staff associate positions; and
2 amending RCW 28A.150.410.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.150.410 and 1997 c 141 s 1 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 (1) The legislature shall establish for each school year in the
7 appropriations act a state-wide salary allocation schedule, for
8 allocation purposes only, to be used to distribute funds for basic
9 education certificated instructional staff salaries under RCW
10 28A.150.260.

11 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall calculate salary
12 allocations for state funded basic education certificated instructional
13 staff by determining the district average salary for basic education
14 and special education instructional staff using the salary allocation
15 schedule established pursuant to this section.

16 (3) Beginning January 1, 1992, no more than ninety college quarter-
17 hour credits received by any employee after the baccalaureate degree
18 may be used to determine compensation allocations under the state
19 salary allocation schedule and LEAP documents referenced in the

1 biennial appropriations act, or any replacement schedules and
2 documents, unless:

3 (a) The employee has a masters degree; or

4 (b) The credits were used in generating state salary allocations
5 before January 1, 1992.

6 (4) Beginning in the 1999-2000 school year, the determination of
7 years of service for occupational therapists, physical therapists,
8 speech-language pathologists, audiologists, and nurses regulated under
9 Title 18 RCW shall include experience in schools and other nonschool
10 positions as occupational therapists, physical therapists, speech-
11 language pathologists, audiologists, or nurses. The calculation of
12 years of service for experience in nonschool positions shall be as
13 follows: Until the 2002-2003 school year, every two years of service
14 in nonschool positions shall be counted as one year of service for
15 purposes of this chapter. Beginning in the 2003-2004 school year and
16 thereafter, every one year of service in nonschool positions shall be
17 counted as one year of service for purposes of this chapter.
