- AN ACT Relating to foster parents; amending RCW 74.14B.080;
- 2 creating a new section; making an appropriation; providing an effective
- 3 date; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature recognizes that Washington
 - state is experiencing a significant shortage of quality foster homes
- 7 and that the majority of children entering the system are difficult to
- 8 place due to their complex needs. The legislature intends to provide
- 9 additional assistance to those families willing to serve as foster
- 10 parents.

- 11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 74.14B.080 and 1991 c 283 s 2 are each amended to read
- 12 as follows:
- 13 (1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, the secretary of
- 14 social and health services shall provide liability insurance to foster
- 15 parents licensed under chapter 74.15 RCW. The coverage shall be for
- 16 personal injury and property damage caused by foster parents or foster
- 17 children that occurred while the children were in foster care. Such
- 18 insurance shall cover acts of ordinary negligence but shall not cover

- 1 illegal conduct or bad faith acts taken by foster parents in providing
- 2 foster care. Moneys paid from liability insurance for any claim are
- 3 limited to the amount by which the claim exceeds the amount available
- 4 to the claimant from any valid and collectible liability insurance.
- 5 The liability insurance provided under this section shall reimburse
- 6 foster parents for the replacement value of the item damaged or
- 7 <u>destroyed</u>.
- 8 (2) The secretary of social and health services may purchase the
- 9 insurance required in subsection (1) of this section or may choose a
- 10 self-insurance method. The total moneys expended pursuant to this
- 11 authorization shall not exceed ((five hundred thousand)) one million
- 12 dollars per biennium. If the secretary elects a method of self-
- 13 insurance, the expenditure shall include all administrative and staff
- 14 costs. If the secretary elects a method of self-insurance, he or she
- 15 may, by rule, place a limit on the maximum amount to be paid on each
- 16 claim.
- 17 (3) Nothing in this section or RCW 4.24.590 is intended to modify
- 18 the foster parent reimbursement plan in place on July 1, 1991.
- 19 (4) The liability insurance program shall be available by July 1,
- 20 1991.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The sum of two hundred ninety thousand
- 22 dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from
- 23 the general fund to the department of social and health services for
- 24 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, to carry out the purposes of
- 25 section 2 of this act.
- 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 27 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 28 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 29 July 1, 1999.
