- 2 products; and amending RCW 82.24.145.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 82.24.145 and 1987 c 496 s 4 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) Except as required in subsection (2) of this section, when 7 property is forfeited under this chapter the department may:
- 8 (((1))) (a) Retain the property or any part thereof for official
- 9 use or upon application by any law enforcement agency of this state,
- 10 another state, or the District of Columbia, or of the United States for
- 11 the exclusive use of enforcing the provisions of this chapter or the
- 12 laws of any other state or the District of Columbia or of the United
- 13 States.
- $((\frac{2}{2}))$ Sell the property at public auction to the highest
- 15 bidder after due advertisement, but the department before delivering
- 16 any of the goods so seized shall require the person to whom the
- 17 property is sold to affix the proper amount of stamps. The proceeds of
- 18 the sale and all moneys forfeited under this chapter shall be first
- 19 applied to the payment of all proper expenses of any investigation

- l leading to the seizure and of the proceedings for forfeiture and sale,
- 2 including expenses of seizure, maintenance of custody, advertising, and
- 3 court costs. The balance of the proceeds and all moneys shall be
- 4 deposited in the general fund of the state. Proper expenses of
- 5 investigation includes costs incurred by any law enforcement agency or
- 6 any federal, state, or local agency.
- 7 (2) When cigarettes or other tobacco products are forfeited under
- 8 this chapter, these products must be promptly destroyed in a manner
- 9 established by the department.
