- 1 AN ACT Relating to occupational drivers' licenses; reenacting and
- 2 amending RCW 46.20.391; and providing an effective date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.391 and 1998 c 209 s 4 and 1998 c 207 s 9 are 5 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 5 each reenacted and amended to read as follows: 6 (1) Any person licensed under this chapter who is convicted of an
- 7 offense relating to motor vehicles for which suspension or revocation
- 8 of the driver's license is mandatory, other than vehicular homicide or
- 9 vehicular assault, or who has had his or her license suspended under
- 10 RCW 46.20.3101 (2)(a) or (3)(a), may submit to the department an
- 11 application for an occupational driver's license. The department, upon
- 12 receipt of the prescribed fee and upon determining that the petitioner
- 13 is engaged in an occupation or trade that makes it essential that the
- 14 petitioner operate a motor vehicle, may issue an occupational driver's
- 15 license and may set definite restrictions as provided in RCW 46.20.394.
- 16 No person may petition for, and the department shall not issue, an
- 17 occupational driver's license that is effective during the first thirty
- 18 days of any suspension or revocation imposed for a violation of RCW
- 19 46.61.502 or 46.61.504 or pursuant to RCW 46.20.3101 (2)(a) or (3)(a).

- 1 A person aggrieved by the decision of the department on the application 2 for an occupational driver's license may request a hearing as provided
- 3 by rule of the department.
- 4 (2)(a) A person licensed under this chapter whose driver's license
- 5 has been suspended administratively due to failure to appear or pay a
- 6 traffic ticket under RCW 46.20.289; a violation of the financial
- 7 responsibility laws under chapter 46.29 RCW; or for multiple violations
- 8 within a specified period of time under RCW 46.20.291, may apply to the
- 9 department for an occupational driver's license if the applicant
- 10 demonstrates to the satisfaction of the department that one of the
- 11 following additional conditions are met:
- 12 (i) The applicant is in an apprenticeship program or an on-the-job
- 13 training program for which a driver's license is required;
- 14 (ii) The applicant presents evidence that he or she has applied for
- 15 <u>a position in an apprenticeship or on-the-job training program and the</u>
- 16 program has certified that a driver's license is required to begin the
- 17 program; or
- 18 (iii) The applicant is in a program that assists persons who are
- 19 enrolled in a WorkFirst program pursuant to chapter 74.08A RCW to
- 20 become gainfully employed and the program requires a driver's license.
- 21 (b) An occupational driver's license issued to an applicant
- 22 <u>described in (a) of this subsection shall be valid for the period of</u>
- 23 the suspension or revocation but not more than two years.
- 24 (c) Upon receipt of evidence that a holder of an occupational
- 25 <u>driver's license granted under this subsection is no longer enrolled in</u>
- 26 an apprenticeship or on-the-job training program, the director shall
- 27 give written notice by first class mail to the driver that the
- 28 <u>occupational driver's license shall be canceled. The effective date of</u>
- 29 cancellation shall be fifteen days from the date of mailing the notice.
- 30 If at any time before the cancellation goes into effect the driver
- 31 submits evidence of continued enrollment in the program, the
- 32 cancellation shall be stayed. If the cancellation becomes effective,
- 33 the driver may obtain, at no additional charge, a new occupational
- 34 <u>driver's license upon submittal of evidence of enrollment in another</u>
- 35 program that meets the criteria set forth in this subsection.
- 36 (3) An applicant for an occupational driver's license is eligible
- 37 to receive such license only if:
- 38 (a) Within one year immediately preceding the date of the offense
- 39 that gave rise to the present conviction, the applicant has not

1 committed any offense relating to motor vehicles for which suspension 2 or revocation of a driver's license is mandatory; and

- 3 (b) Within seven years immediately preceding the date of the 4 offense that gave rise to the present conviction or incident, the 5 applicant has not committed any of the following offenses: (i) Driving 6 or being in actual physical control of a motor vehicle while under the 7 influence of intoxicating liquor; (ii) vehicular homicide under RCW 46.61.520; or (iii) vehicular assault under RCW 46.61.522; and
- 9 (c) The applicant is engaged in an occupation or trade that makes 10 it essential that he or she operate a motor vehicle, except as allowed 11 under subsection (2)(a) of this section; and
- 12 (d) The applicant files satisfactory proof of financial 13 responsibility pursuant to chapter 46.29 RCW.
- 14  $((\frac{3}{2}))$  (4) The director shall cancel an occupational driver's 15 license upon receipt of notice that the holder thereof has been convicted of operating a motor vehicle in violation of 16 17 restrictions, or of an offense that pursuant to chapter 46.20 RCW would warrant suspension or revocation of a regular driver's license. 18 19 cancellation is effective as of the date of the conviction, and 20 continues with the same force and effect as any suspension or revocation under this title. 21
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act takes effect January 1, 2000.
