1 AN ACT Relating to expanding the national guard scholarship
2 program; and amending RCW 28B.103.010.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.103.010 and 1994 c 234 s 5 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in
7 this section apply throughout this section and RCW 28B.103.020 and
8 28B.103.030.

9 (1) "Eligible student" means an enlisted member or an officer of
10 the rank of captain or below in the Washington national guard who (~~is~~
11 ~~a resident student as defined in RCW 28B.15.012 and 28B.15.013, who~~)
12 attends an institution of higher education that is (~~located in this~~
13 ~~state and~~) accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and
14 Colleges, and who meets any additional selection criteria adopted by
15 the office.

16 (2) "Conditional scholarship" means a loan that is forgiven in
17 whole or in part if the recipient renders service as a member of the
18 Washington national guard under rules adopted by the office.

1 (3) "Forgiven" or "to forgive" or "forgiveness" means either to
2 render service in the Washington national guard in lieu of monetary
3 repayment, or to be relieved of the service obligation under rules
4 adopted by the office.

5 (4) "Office" means the office of the adjutant general of the state
6 military department.

7 (5) "Participant" means an eligible student who has received a
8 conditional scholarship under this chapter.

9 (6) "Service obligation" means serving in the Washington national
10 guard for one additional year for each year of conditional scholarship
11 received under this program.
