- 1 AN ACT Relating to the raw fur and products that include the raw
- 2 fur of dogs and cats; adding a new section to chapter 9.08 RCW; and
- 3 prescribing penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 9.08 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 (1) A person may not knowingly trap, take, breed, shelter, tend,
- 8 feed, or kill a domestic dog or cat for the purpose of dealing in the
- 9 raw fur, or products that include the raw fur, of a domestic dog or
- 10 cat. A person may not knowingly buy, sell, barter, or otherwise
- 11 exchange for profit the raw fur, or products that include the raw fur,
- 12 of a domestic dog or cat.
- 13 (2) Nothing in this section is intended to prevent a person or the
- 14 person's agent from:
- (a) Killing dogs injuring stock, under RCW 16.08.020;
- 16 (b) Taking into custody or destroying dogs harassing deer or elk,
- 17 after an emergency has been declared, under RCW 77.12.315;

1 (c) Purchasing, receiving, or reselling raw furs for profit, or 2 dealing in raw furs for commercial profit, under chapters 77.15 and 3 77.32 RCW; or

- (d) Having a pet dog or cat stuffed by a licensed taxidermist, practicing taxidermy for profit, or selling an item produced by a taxidermist, under chapters 77.15 and 77.32 RCW.
- (3) The first conviction under this section is a gross misdemeanor punishable under RCW 9A.20.021(2), and by a mandatory fine of not less than five hundred dollars per pet animal. A second or subsequent conviction under this section is a class C felony punishable under RCW 9A.20.021(1)(c), and by a mandatory fine of not less than one thousand dollars per pet animal.
