- 1 AN ACT Relating to preventing access by minors to materials about
- 2 bomb making; adding a new chapter to Title 9 RCW; prescribing
- B penalties; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 6 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
- 7 chapter.
- 8 (1) "Bomb" means any device containing an explosive substance and
- 9 capable of being exploded. "Bomb" does not include fireworks or small
- 10 arms ammunition or small arms primers as defined and authorized under
- 11 state or federal law.
- 12 (2) "Material" means a picture film or a publication, or any
- 13 combination thereof.
- 14 (a) "Picture film" means any film, film or plate negative, film or
- 15 plate positive, film designed to be projected on a screen for
- 16 exhibition, glass slides or transparencies, either in negative or
- 17 positive form, designed for exhibition by projection on a screen,
- 18 videotape, or any other medium used to electronically transmit or
- 19 reproduce images on a screen.

- (b) "Publication" means any book, magazine, article, pamphlet, 1 writing, printing illustration, picture, sound recording, electronic 2 3 transmission, or telephonic communication.
  - (3) "Knowledge" means knowledge as defined in RCW 9A.08.010(1)(b).
- 4 5 (4) "Knowledge of its character" means that the person has depicts, or describes knowledge that the material contains, 6 7 instructions about explosive devices or substances with such 8 specificity and sufficiency that a person using the information would be able to assemble a bomb and cause it to be detonated. 9 10 knowledge may be proved by direct or circumstantial evidence, or both. "Instructions" does not include information clearly and obviously 11 intended for safety instructional purposes only. 12
- 13 (5) "Minor" means any person under the age of eighteen years.
- 14 (6) "Person" means any individual, partnership, firm, association, 15 corporation, or other legal entity.
- 16 Sec. 2. No person may with knowledge of its NEW SECTION. character provide materials about bomb making in such a way that 17 18 minors, as part of the invited general public, are able to access the 19 materials. However, a person is deemed not to have provided access to materials about bomb making to minors if: 20
- 21 (1) The materials about bomb making are kept in an area that is not 22 accessible to minors without the consent of the minor's parent or 23 quardian; or
- 24 (2) In the case of an operator who transmits materials about bomb 25 making via cable television transmissions, the operator first notifies the subscriber of the availability of a device that allows a subscriber 26 27 to prohibit access to the viewing of a particular cable transmission; 28 or
- (3) In the case of a person who provides a minor with access to a 29 computer containing material about bomb making that is stored locally, 30 or that can be connected to the internet, the computer is equipped with 31 32 specialized filtering software actively installed for the purpose of protecting minors from accessing materials about bomb making; or 33
- 34 (4) In the case of a person publishing a world wide web page containing materials about bomb making, the web page contains codes or 35 36 hidden comments that trigger the blocking mechanisms of any browser-37 filtering software that is designed for the purpose of protecting minors from accessing materials about bomb making; or 38

- 1 (5) In the case of a person hosting or mirroring internet content 2 on servers located within the state of Washington, the person mandates 3 the inclusion in all web pages of codes or hidden comments that trigger 4 the blocking mechanisms of any browser-filtering software that is 5 designed for the purpose of protecting minors from accessing materials 6 about bomb making; or
- 7 (6) In the case of a person providing electronic communications or 8 telecommunications access or connection to or from a facility, system, 9 or network, whether one-way or interactive, including transmission, 10 downloading, storage, navigational tools, and related capabilities that are incidental to the provision of the electronic communications or 11 telecommunications access or connection, the person mandates the 12 13 inclusion in all web pages of codes or hidden comments that trigger the blocking mechanisms of any browser-filtering software that is designed 14 15 for the purpose of protecting minors from accessing materials about bomb making, or to sell, furnish, present, distribute, allow to view or 16 17 hear, or otherwise disseminate to a minor, with or without consideration, any materials about bomb making. 18
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** In any prosecution for violation of section 20 2 of this act, it is an affirmative defense that:
- 21 (1) The materials about bomb making were displayed or otherwise 22 disseminated to a minor by the minor's parent or legal guardian, for a 23 bona fide purpose; or
- (2) The person made a reasonable good faith attempt to ascertain the true age of the minor by requiring production of a driver's license, marriage license, birth certificate, or other governmental or educational identification card or paper, or copy thereof if supplied by mail or electronic facsimile when in-person production thereof is impractical, and not relying solely on the oral allegations or apparent age of the minor; or
- 31 (3) If engaged in the commercial distribution of materials about 32 bomb making by electronic or telephonic transmission, access by persons 33 under eighteen years of age is restricted by requiring use of a 34 verified credit card, debit account, adult access code, or adult 35 personal identification number before transmission of the material.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. (1) A person who is convicted of violating section 2 of this act is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

- 1 (2) Each day that a violation of section 2 of this act occurs or 2 continues is a separate offense and is punishable as a separate 3 violation.
- 4 (3) Every act, thing, or transaction prohibited by section 2 of 5 this act is a separate offense as to each item involved and is 6 punishable as such.
- 7 (4) For the purpose of this section, multiple copies of the same 8 identical item, or other such identical materials are a single offense.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** (1) Any person who is injured by a bomb, 10 any person who is a parent, guardian, or sibling of a person who has 11 been injured or killed by a bomb, and the estate of a person who has 12 been killed by a bomb has a cause of action against:
- (a) Any person who committed a violation of section 2 of this act 13 14 and as a result of the violation the person was injured or killed; and 15 (b) Any parent or guardian of a minor who knew that a minor under 16 his or her control possessed a bomb without the parent's or quardian's consent or not for a bona fide purpose, or who reasonably should have 17 18 known that a minor under his or her control possessed a bomb for other 19 than a bona fide purpose, and who failed to ensure the bomb was disposed of in a lawful manner, and as a result of the failure the 20 21 person was injured or killed.
- (2) In such an action, in addition to damages for medical, hospital, medication expenses, and loss of services and support, damages may be recovered for pain and suffering and the loss of love and companionship of the person in such amount as, under all the circumstances of the case, may be just.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Sections 1 through 5 of this act constitute a new chapter in Title 9 RCW.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
