- 1 AN ACT Relating to public assistance recipients participating in
- 2 higher education programs; and amending RCW 74.08A.250.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 74.08A.250 and 1997 c 58 s 311 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, as used in this 7 chapter, "work activity" means:
- 8 (1) Unsubsidized paid employment in the private or public sector;
- 9 (2) Subsidized paid employment in the private or public sector,
- 10 <u>including employment through the state work-study program for a period</u>
- 11 not to exceed twenty-four months;
- 12 (3) Work experience, including work associated with the
- 13 refurbishing of publicly assisted housing, if sufficient paid
- 14 employment is not available;
- 15 (4) On-the-job training;
- 16 (5) Job search and job readiness assistance;
- 17 (6) Community service programs;
- 18 (7) Vocational educational training, not to exceed twelve months
- 19 with respect to any individual;

- 2 (9) Education directly related to employment, in the case of a recipient who has not received a high school diploma or a GED;
 - (10) Satisfactory attendance at secondary school or in a course of study leading to a GED, in the case of a recipient who has not completed secondary school or received such a certificate;
- 7 (11) The provision of child care services to an individual who is 8 participating in a community service program; ((and))
- 9 (12) <u>Internships, that shall be paid or unpaid work experience</u> 10 <u>performed by an intern in a business, industry, or government or</u> 11 <u>nongovernmental agency setting;</u>
- (13) Practicums, which include any educational program in which a student is working under the close supervision of a professional in an agency, clinic, or other professional practice setting for purposes of advancing their skills and knowledge; and
- 16 $\underline{(14)}$ Services required by the recipient under RCW 74.08.025(3) and 74.08A.010(3) to become employable.
