- 1 AN ACT Relating to safety devices for flaggers; adding a new
- 2 section to chapter 49.17 RCW; creating new sections; and declaring an
- 3 emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 49.17 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) The director shall adopt rules that take effect no later than
- 8 July 1, 2000, revising the signs, signals, and barricades standards
- 9 governing flaggers used in traffic control operations. The rules must
- 10 be designed to improve options available to ensure the safety of the
- 11 traffic control operations.
- 12 (2) The director may take the necessary steps to ensure that the
- 13 rules required by subsection (1) of this section take effect no later
- 14 than July 1, 2000. In developing the rules, the department must
- 15 consult with the Washington state department of transportation and
- 16 other persons with an interest in improving the safety of traffic
- 17 control operations.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The director of the department of labor and
- 2 industries must report, by September 15, 2000, to the senate labor and
- 3 workforce development committee and the house commerce and labor
- 4 committee on the rules adopted under section 1 of this act.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Section 1 of this act is necessary for the
- 6 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or
- 7 support of the state government and its existing public institutions,
- 8 and takes effect immediately.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** This act shall be known and cited as the
- 10 "Kim Vendl Worker Safety Act."
