- 1 AN ACT Relating to creating a K-12 accountability and information
- 2 system; creating a new section; making appropriations; and declaring an
- 3 emergency.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The superintendent of public
 - instruction, to the extent funds are appropriated for this purpose,
- 7 shall design and implement a state-wide K-12 student accountability and
- 8 information system. The system shall provide data and other
- 9 information to accurately calculate for schools and school districts:
- 10 (a) Drop-out and graduation rates; (b) student mobility; (c) student
- 11 attendance; (d) academic achievement over time; and (e) other
- 12 indicators and information that measure, or contribute to, student
- 13 achievement and performance. To the maximum extent possible, the
- 14 superintendent of public instruction shall design the system so that it
- 15 can be integrated with other student, fiscal, and personnel information
- 16 systems and so that paperwork is reduced and more staff time in schools
- 17 and districts is directed to local work. The superintendent of public
- 18 instruction shall ensure that all feasible safeguards are in place to
- 19 prevent the unauthorized release of confidential student information

- 1 and that state-level access to student-level data be limited to data
- 2 that is required for accountability or fiscal purposes. No individual
- 3 student data regarding discipline and behavior shall be accessible at
- 4 the state level. In developing the system, the superintendent of
- 5 public instruction shall implement a student identification system that
- 6 does not use social security numbers. It is the intent of the
- 7 legislature to have the system implemented in all school districts no
- 8 later than the beginning of the 2001-02 school year.
- 9 (2) In designing, developing, and implementing the information
- 10 system in subsection (1) of this section, the superintendent of public
- 11 instruction shall consult the academic achievement and accountability
- 12 commission, school district personnel, privacy experts, system
- 13 designers in other states, and other appropriate individuals. The
- 14 system shall be designed so that it is easily implemented in schools
- 15 and school district offices.
- 16 (3) By September 1, 2000, the superintendent shall present to the
- 17 house of representatives and senate education and fiscal committees,
- 18 the governor, and the academic achievement and accountability
- 19 commission: (a) A prototype of the system; (b) an implementation
- 20 timeline; (c) projected future costs; (d) confidentiality safeguards;
- 21 and (e) training needs.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The sum of two hundred thousand dollars,
- 23 or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal
- 24 year ending June 30, 2000, from the general fund to the office of the
- 25 superintendent of public instruction for the purposes of this act.
- 26 (2) The sum of eight hundred thousand dollars, or as much thereof
- 27 as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June
- 28 30, 2001, from the general fund to the office of the superintendent of
- 29 public instruction for the purposes of this act.
- 30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 31 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 32 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 33 immediately.
