- 1 AN ACT Relating to granting state-wide warrant jurisdiction to
- 2 courts of limited jurisdiction; amending RCW 3.66.010, 3.66.060,
- 3 3.66.070, 3.46.030, 3.50.020, and 35.20.030; and creating a new
- 4 section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The administrator for the courts shall
- 7 establish a pilot program for the efficient state-wide processing of
- 8 warrants issued by courts of limited jurisdiction. The pilot program
- 9 shall contain procedures and criteria for courts of limited
- 10 jurisdiction to enter into agreements with other courts of limited
- 11 jurisdiction throughout the state to process each other's warrants when
- 12 the defendant is within the processing court's jurisdiction. The
- 13 administrator for the courts shall establish a formula for allocating
- 14 between the court processing the warrant and the court that issued the
- 15 warrant any moneys collected and costs associated with the processing
- 16 of warrants.
- 17 **Sec. 2.** RCW 3.66.010 and 1984 c 258 s 40 are each amended to read
- 18 as follows:

(1) The justices of the peace elected in accordance with chapters 1 3.30 through 3.74 RCW are authorized to hold court as judges of the 2 3 district court for the trial of all actions enumerated in chapters 3.30 4 through 3.74 RCW or assigned to the district court by law; to hear, try, and determine the same according to the law, and for that purpose 5 where no special provision is otherwise made by law, such court shall 6 be vested with all the necessary powers which are possessed by courts 7 8 of record in this state; and all laws of a general nature shall apply 9 to such district court as far as the same may be applicable and not 10 inconsistent with the provisions of chapters 3.30 through 3.74 RCW. The district court shall, upon the demand of either party, impanel a 11 jury to try any civil or criminal case in accordance with the 12 13 provisions of chapter 12.12 RCW. No jury trial may be held in a proceeding involving a traffic infraction. 14

15 (2) The district court shall have state-wide jurisdiction to take 16 recognizance, approve bail, and arraign defendants held within the 17 jurisdiction on warrants issued by any judicial officer of a court of 18 limited jurisdiction within the state.

19 **Sec. 3.** RCW 3.66.060 and 1984 c 258 s 44 are each amended to read 20 as follows:

The district court shall have jurisdiction: (1) Concurrent with 21 the superior court of all misdemeanors and gross misdemeanors committed 22 23 in their respective counties and of all violations of city ordinances. 24 It shall in no event impose a greater punishment than a fine of five 25 thousand dollars, or imprisonment for one year in the county or city 26 jail as the case may be, or both such fine and imprisonment, unless otherwise expressly provided by statute. It may suspend and revoke 27 vehicle operators' licenses in the cases provided by law; (2) to sit as 28 29 a committing magistrate and conduct preliminary hearings in cases 30 provided by law; (3) concurrent with the superior court of a proceeding to keep the peace in their respective counties; (4) concurrent with the 31 superior court of all violations under Title 75 RCW; ((and)) (5) to 32 hear and determine traffic infractions under chapter 46.63 RCW; and (6) 33 to take recognizance, approve bail, and arraign defendants held within 34 the jurisdiction on warrants issued by any judicial officer of a court 35

of limited jurisdiction within the state.

1 **Sec. 4.** RCW 3.66.070 and 1991 c 290 s 2 are each amended to read 2 as follows:

3 All criminal actions shall be brought in the district where the 4 alleged violation occurred: PROVIDED, That (1) the prosecuting attorney may file felony cases in the district in which the county seat 5 is located, (2) with the consent of the defendant criminal actions 6 7 other than those arising out of violations of city ordinances may be 8 brought in or transferred to the district in which the county seat is 9 located, ((and)) (3) if the alleged violation relates to driving, or being in actual physical control of, a motor vehicle while under the 10 influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug and the alleged violation 11 occurred within a judicial district which has been designated an 12 enhanced enforcement district under RCW 2.56.110, the charges may be 13 filed in that district or in a district within the same county which is 14 15 adjacent to the district in which the alleged violation occurred, and (4) the district court shall have state-wide jurisdiction to take 16 recognizance, approve bail, and arraign defendants held within the 17 jurisdiction on warrants issued by any judicial officer of a court of 18 19 limited jurisdiction within the state.

20 **Sec. 5.** RCW 3.46.030 and 1985 c 303 s 13 are each amended to read 21 as follows:

A municipal department shall have exclusive jurisdiction of matters arising from ordinances of the city, state-wide jurisdiction to take recognizance, approve bail, and arraign defendants held within the jurisdiction on warrants issued by any judicial officer of a court of limited jurisdiction within the state, and no jurisdiction of other matters except as conferred by statute.

28 **Sec. 6.** RCW 3.50.020 and 1985 c 303 s 14 are each amended to read 29 as follows:

The municipal court shall have exclusive original jurisdiction over traffic infractions arising under city ordinances and exclusive original criminal jurisdiction of all violations of city ordinances duly adopted by the city in which the municipal court is located and shall have original jurisdiction of all other actions brought to enforce or recover license penalties or forfeitures declared or given by such ordinances or by state statutes. The municipal court shall also have the jurisdiction as conferred by statute. The municipal

- court is empowered to forfeit cash bail or bail bonds and issue execution thereon; and in general to hear and determine all causes, civil or criminal, including traffic infractions, arising under such ordinances and to pronounce judgment in accordance therewith. The municipal court may take recognizance, approve bail, and arraign defendants held within the jurisdiction on warrants issued by any judicial officer of a court of limited jurisdiction within the state.
- 8 **Sec. 7.** RCW 35.20.030 and 1993 c 83 s 3 are each amended to read 9 as follows:
- The municipal court shall have jurisdiction to try violations of 10 all city ordinances and all other actions brought to enforce or recover 11 license penalties or forfeitures declared or given by any such 12 13 ordinances. It is empowered to forfeit cash bail or bail bonds and 14 issue execution thereon, to hear and determine all causes, civil or criminal, arising under such ordinances, and to pronounce judgment in 15 accordance therewith: PROVIDED, That for a violation of the criminal 16 17 provisions of an ordinance no greater punishment shall be imposed than 18 a fine of five thousand dollars or imprisonment in the city jail not to exceed one year, or both such fine and imprisonment, but the punishment 19 for any criminal ordinance shall be the same as the punishment provided 20 in state law for the same crime. All civil and criminal proceedings in 21 municipal court, and judgments rendered therein, shall be subject to 22 23 review in the superior court by writ of review or on appeal: PROVIDED, 24 That an appeal from the court's determination or order in a traffic 25 infraction proceeding may be taken only in accordance with RCW Costs in civil and criminal cases may be taxed as 26 46.63.090(5). 27 provided in district courts. The municipal court may take recognizance, approve bail, and arraign defendants held within the 28 29 jurisdiction on warrants issued by any judicial officer of a court of limited jurisdiction within the state. 30
