- 1 AN ACT Relating to a foster care scholarship program; adding a new
- 2 section to chapter 28B.80 RCW; creating a new section; and making an
- 3 appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that access to a
- 6 higher education will give children who are in foster care hope for the
- 7 future. The legislature further finds that such assistance will help
- 8 these children become successful, productive, contributing citizens and
- 9 avoid cycles of abuse, poverty, violence, and delinquency.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.80 RCW
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (1) The foster care scholarship program is created. The purpose of
- 13 the program is to help students who were in foster care attend an
- 14 institution of higher education in the state of Washington.
- 15 (2) To the extent funds are appropriated, the higher education
- 16 coordinating board shall award grants to eligible students to help
- 17 cover the costs of receiving a higher education at an institution of
- 18 higher education in Washington state. The grant shall be in an amount

- 1 not to exceed the costs of obtaining a higher education, excluding
- 2 tuition. The higher education coordinating board shall establish
- 3 procedures, by rule, to disburse the awards as direct grants to 4 students.
- 5 (3) To qualify for the grant, a student shall:
- 6 (a) Be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-three;
- 7 (b) Have been in foster care in the state of Washington for a 8 minimum of six months since his or her fourteenth birthday;
- 9 (c) Be eligible for financial aid under the state student financial 10 aid program;
- 11 (d) Enter an institution of higher education or vocational program 12 in Washington state within three years of high school graduation or 13 having successfully received his or her GED;
- (e) Be making satisfactory progress towards completion of a degree or certificate program; and
- 16 (f) Not be pursuing a degree in theology.
- 17 (4) If a student is eligible under subsection (3) of this section, 18 the student may receive a maximum of eight semesters or twelve quarters 19 of grants for higher education in the state of Washington.
- 20 (5) An eligible student may transfer among institutions of higher 21 education in Washington and continue to receive the grant.
- 22 (6) Grants under this section shall not affect eligibility for the 23 state student financial aid program.
- (7) The higher education coordinating board shall work with the department of social and health services and the superintendent of public instruction to provide information about this program to children in foster care in the state of Washington and to students sixteen years and over who would be eligible for the program.
- 29 (8) As used in this section, "institutions of higher education" 30 includes:
- 31 (a) Public institutions of higher education, as defined in RCW 32 28B.10.016;
- 33 (b) Private, nonprofit educational institutions, the main campus of 34 which is permanently situated in the state, providing programs of 35 education beyond the high school level, leading to a degree or 36 certificate, and accredited by the northwest association of schools and 37 colleges as of the effective date of this section;

- 1 (c) Other institutions that are approved by the higher education 2 coordinating board as meeting equivalent standards as those 3 institutions accredited under this section.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** The sum of one hundred thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for fiscal year ending June 30, 2001, from the general fund to the higher education coordinating board for the purposes of this act.
