- AN ACT Relating to second-hand child safety seats; adding a new chapter to Title 19 RCW; prescribing penalties; and providing an
- 3 effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The definitions in this section apply 6 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 7 (1) "Child safety seat" means any device, except safety belts,
- 8 designed for use in a motor vehicle to restrain, seat, or position a
- 9 child who weighs fifty pounds or less.
- 10 (2) "Second-hand child safety seat" means any child safety seat
- 11 that is being sold or distributed after its purchase by its original
- 12 owner.
- 13 (3) "Distributing organization" means a charitable nonprofit
- 14 organization under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c) of the federal internal
- 15 revenue code, or a public health agency acting on behalf of or in
- 16 conjunction with a charitable nonprofit organization, which distributes
- 17 children's items to needy persons free of charge and includes any
- 18 nonprofit organization that distributes children's items free of charge
- 19 to other nonprofit organizations or the public. A public health agency

- 1 shall not otherwise be considered a distributing organization for
- 2 purposes of this chapter when it is carrying out other functions and
- 3 responsibilities under Title 70 RCW.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) Any corporation, partnership,
- 5 association, or distributing organization that sells or distributes
- 6 second-hand child safety seats shall post and maintain at or near the
- 7 point of sale, point of distribution, or display location, durable and
- 8 legible signs informing the public of the dangers of using a second-
- 9 hand child safety seat.
- 10 (2) The content of the sign shall conform with standards adopted by 11 the Washington state patrol pursuant to section 3 of this act.
- 12 (3) A corporation, partnership, association, or distributing 13 organization that violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and 14 on conviction is subject to a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars.
- 15 (4) Violation of this section or section 1 of this act is a matter
- 16 affecting the public interest for the purpose of applying chapter 19.86
- 17 RCW. Failure to comply with this chapter is not reasonable in relation
- 18 to the development and preservation of business. A violation of this
- 19 chapter constitutes an unfair or deceptive act or practice in trade or
- 20 commerce for the purposes of applying chapter 19.86 RCW.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The Washington state patrol shall adopt
- 22 standards regarding the minimum content and size of signs posted by
- 23 corporations, partnerships, associations, or distributing organizations
- 24 to warn consumers of the dangers of using a second-hand child safety
- 25 seat. The content of the signs shall include text regarding the risks
- 26 associated with unobservable damage to child safety seats, the risks
- 27 related to the deterioration of the child safety seat components over
- 28 time, inspection recommendations for the consumer when purchasing a
- 29 second-hand child safety seat, phone numbers for the consumer to use to
- 30 determine if a second-hand child safety seat has been recalled, and the
- 31 risks that a child safety seat may not be subject to federal safety
- 32 standards.
- 33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Sections 1 through 3 of this act constitute
- 34 a new chapter in Title 19 RCW.
