- 1 AN ACT Relating to community-based housing for persons with
- 2 developmental disabilities, mental illness, and youth with
- 3 disabilities; and amending RCW 79.01.007 and 43.79.201.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 79.01.007 and 1991 c 204 s 5 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 Where C.E.P. & R.I. land has the potential for lease for
- 8 commercial, industrial, or residential uses or other uses with the
- 9 potential for high economic return and is within urban or suburban
- 10 areas, the department of natural resources shall make every effort
- 11 consistent with trust land management principles and all other
- 12 provisions of law to lease the lands for such purposes, unless the land
- 13 is subject to a lease to a state agency operating an existing state
- 14 institution. The department of natural resources is authorized,
- 15 subject to approval by the board of natural resources and only if a
- 16 higher return can be realized, to exchange such lands for lands of at
- 17 least equal value and to sell such lands and use the proceeds to
- 18 acquire replacement lands. The department shall report to the
- 19 appropriate legislative committees all C.E.P. & R.I. land purchased,

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- 1 sold, or exchanged. Income from the leases shall be deposited in the
- 2 charitable, educational, penal, and reformatory institutions account.
- 3 ((The legislature shall give priority consideration to appropriating
- 4 one-half of the money derived from lease income to providing community
- 5 housing for persons who are mentally ill, developmentally disabled, or
- 6 youth who are blind, deaf, or otherwise disabled.))
- 7 **Sec. 2.** RCW 43.79.201 and 1995 c 399 s 77 are each amended to read 8 as follows:
- 9 (1) The charitable, educational, penal and reformatory institutions
- 10 account is hereby created, in the state treasury, into which account
- 11 there shall be deposited all moneys arising from the sale, lease or
- 12 transfer of the land granted by the United States government to the
- 13 state for charitable, educational, penal and reformatory institutions
- 14 by section 17 of the enabling act, or otherwise set apart for such
- 15 institutions, except all moneys arising from the sale, lease, or
- 16 transfer of that certain one hundred thousand acres of such land
- 17 assigned for the support of the University of Washington by chapter 91,
- 18 Laws of 1903 and section 9, chapter 122, Laws of 1893.
- 19 (2) ((If feasible,)) (a) Not less than one-half of all income to
- 20 the charitable, educational, penal, and reformatory institutions
- 21 account shall be appropriated for the purpose of providing housing,
- 22 including repair and renovation of state institutions, for persons who
- 23 are mentally ill, ((developmentally disabled)) have developmental
- 24 <u>disabilities</u>, or youth who are blind, deaf, or otherwise disabled.
- 25 ((If moneys are appropriated for community-based housing, the moneys
- 26 shall be appropriated to the department of community, trade, and
- 27 economic development for the housing assistance program under chapter
- 28 43.185 RCW.))
- 29 (b) Not less than one-half of lease income to the charitable,
- 30 educational, penal, and reformatory institutions account shall be
- 31 appropriated for the purpose of providing community-based housing, or
- 32 operating and maintaining community-based housing, for persons who are
- 33 mentally ill, have developmental disabilities, or youth who are blind,
- 34 <u>deaf</u>, or otherwise <u>disabled</u>. When moneys are appropriated for
- 35 community-based housing, the moneys shall be appropriated to the
- 36 department of community, trade, and economic development for housing

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- 1 developed through the housing assistance program under chapter 43.185
- 2 RCW.

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
