1 AN ACT Relating to annexations by less than county-wide port
2 districts in areas having no registered voters; and amending RCW
3 53.04.180 and 53.04.150.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 53.04.180 and 1999 c 250 s 5 are each amended to read
6 as follows:

7 (1) By a majority vote of the commission, and with the written
8 consent of all the owners of the property to be annexed, a port
9 commission of a district that is less than county-wide, and that is
10 located in a county with a population of less than ninety thousand and
11 located in either the Interstate 5 or Interstate 90 corridor, may
12 annex, for industrial development or other port district purposes,
13 property contiguous to the district's boundaries and not located within
14 the boundaries of any other port district.

15 (2) The written consent required by subsection (1) of this section
16 must contain a full and correct legal description of the property to be
17 annexed, must include the signature of all owners of the property to be
18 annexed, and must be addressed to and filed with the commission.

1 (3) If the commission approves annexation under this section, it
2 shall do so by resolution and shall file a certified copy of the
3 resolution with the board of county commissioners of the county in
4 which the annexed property is located. Upon the date fixed in the
5 resolution, the area annexed becomes part of the district.

6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 53.04.150 and 1999 c 250 s 2 are each amended to read
7 as follows:

8 A port district that is less than county-wide, and that is located
9 in a county with a population of less than ninety thousand and located
10 in either the Interstate 5 or Interstate 90 corridor, may petition for
11 annexation of an area that is contiguous to its boundaries, is not
12 located within the boundaries of any other port district, and contains
13 no registered voters. The petition must be in writing, addressed to
14 and filed with the port commission, and signed by the owners of not
15 less than seventy-five percent of the property value in the area to be
16 annexed, according to the assessed value for general taxation. The
17 petition must contain a legal description of the property according to
18 government legal subdivisions or legal plats, or a sufficient metes and
19 bounds description, and must be accompanied by a plat outlining the
20 boundaries of the property to be annexed.

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
