HOUSE BILL 3061

- AN ACT Relating to public facility siting and planning; adding a new section to chapter 36.70A RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that current processes 5 for the siting and operation of major regional public facilities often 6 fail to adequately address regional and localized impacts and benefits 7 of such facilities. Throughout the state there are proposals for siting major public facilities in which surrounding neighborhoods and 8 9 communities will be disproportionately impacted while the benefits of 10 the facility are provided to the larger region or to the entire state. 11 These facilities include major transportation facilities such as lines. 12 highways, bridges, airports, and rail and 13 nontransportation facilities such as prisons and landfills. The 14 legislature also finds that although the growth management act provides 15 procedures for establishing county-wide policies for coordinated planning of such facilities, those procedures do not include all public 16 17 entities that provide such facilities and do not provide sufficient guidance to local jurisdictions to ensure consideration and mitigation 18

- 1 of impacts to surrounding communities and participation in siting 2 processes by those communities.
- Therefore, it is the intent of the legislature to ensure that these considerations are incorporated into the county-wide planning policies required under the growth management act, and to provide sufficient authority so that siting decisions and mitigation measures adopted through using such policies may be fully implemented.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 36.70A RCW 9 to read as follows:
- Recognizing that RCW 36.70A.103 requires state agencies to comply 10 with local comprehensive plans and development regulations, that 11 12 planning for public facilities and mitigating impacts from these public 13 facilities are cornerstones of this chapter, the requirement that 14 county-wide planning policies must address the siting of public capital 15 facilities of a state-wide significance, and the importance of siting 16 essential public facilities recognized under RCW 36.70A.200, it is the policy of the state that state agencies must mitigate impacts to 17 18 communities arising from the siting or expansion of state capital 19 facilities of state-wide significance, including transportation facilities of state-wide significance that are provided under chapter 20 47.46 RCW. These mitigation requirements include, but are not limited 21 to, impacts to county, city, and town roads and streets, noise impacts, 22 23 life-style impacts of affected communities, and view impacts. 24 mitigation of these impacts is declared to be part of the costs of the 25 state capital facilities of state-wide significance and shall be mitigated from moneys used to finance the state capital facilities of 26 state-wide significance. 27
