
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 4411

State of Washington 56th Legislature 1999 Regular Session

1 WHEREAS, The Shoreline Management Act was adopted to protect the
2 unique characteristics and values of the state's shorelines; and

3 WHEREAS, The Shoreline Management Act established a system of
4 coordinated planning and development review for shorelines of the
5 state; and

6 WHEREAS, Appropriate and publicly supported temporary shoreline
7 development may be inadvertently impeded through the permit review
8 process provided under the act; and

9 WHEREAS, Other state statutes may also inadvertently create
10 barriers to efficient processing of permits for appropriate
11 development;

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of
13 the state of Washington, the Senate concurring, That a joint select
14 committee be established to develop and review the options for
15 streamlining permit processing for temporary developments in shorelines
16 of the state as provided under the Shoreline Management Act, as well as
17 other state statutes, in order that appropriate and publicly acceptable
18 economic development may be facilitated rather than impeded, and that
19 such committee be provided with staff support from the Office of
20 Program Research and Senate Committee Services; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee consist of four members,
2 one member representing each of the four major political caucuses
3 respectively. The Senate members shall be appointed by the President
4 of the Senate and House members shall be appointed by the Co-Speakers
5 of the House of Representatives; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and
7 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature
8 for the regular legislative session in 2000; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee shall
10 terminate no later than December 31, 1999.
