 - (1) Unsubsidized paid employment in the private or public sector;

- 13 (a) An internship or practicum, that is paid or unpaid and is

- 4 (7) Vocational educational training, not to exceed twelve months 5 with respect to any individual;
 - (8) Job skills training directly related to employment;
- 7 (9) Education directly related to employment, in the case of a 8 recipient who has not received a high school diploma or a GED;
- 9 (10) Satisfactory attendance at secondary school or in a course of 10 study leading to a GED, in the case of a recipient who has not 11 completed secondary school or received such a certificate;
- 12 (11) The provision of child care services to an individual who is participating in a community service program; ((and))
- 14 (12) <u>Internships, that shall be paid or unpaid work experience</u> 15 <u>performed by an intern in a business, industry, or government or</u> 16 <u>nongovernmental agency setting;</u>
- (13) Practicums, which include any educational program in which a student is working under the close supervision of a professional in an agency, clinic, or other professional practice setting for purposes of advancing their skills and knowledge; and
- 21 (14) Services required by the recipient under RCW 74.08.025(3) and 22 74.08A.010(3) to become employable.
