4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **PART I**
6 **DEFINITIONS**

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 101.** The definitions in this section apply
8 throughout this title unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

9 (1) "Commission" means the state parks and recreation commission.

10 (2) "Chair" means the member of the commission elected pursuant to
11 RCW 43.51.030 (as recodified by this act).

12 (3) "Director" and "director of the state parks and recreation
13 commission" mean the director of parks and recreation or the director's
14 designee.

15 (4) "Recreation" means those activities of a voluntary and leisure
16 time nature that aid in promoting entertainment, pleasure, play,
17 relaxation, or instruction.

18 (5) "Natural forest" means a forest that faithfully represents, or
19 is meant to become representative of, its unaltered state.

20 **PART II**
21 **GENERAL POLICIES**

22 **Sec. 201.** RCW 43.51.030 and 1965 c 8 s 43.51.030 are each amended
23 to read as follows:

24 The commission shall elect one of its members as (~~chairman~~)
25 chair. The commission may be convened at such times as the
26 (~~chairman~~) chair deems necessary, and a majority shall constitute a
27 quorum for the transaction of business.

28 **PART III**
29 **DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE COMMISSION**

30 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 301.** In addition to whatever other duties may
31 exist in law or be imposed in the future, it is the duty of the
32 commission to:

1 (1) Implement integrated pest management practices and regulate
2 pests as required by RCW 17.15.020;

3 (2) Take steps necessary to control spartina and purple loosestrife
4 as required by RCW 17.26.020;

5 (3) Participate in the implementation of chapter 19.02 RCW;

6 (4) Coordinate planning and provide staffing and administrative
7 assistance to the Lewis and Clark trail committee as required by RCW
8 27.34.340;

9 (5) Administer those portions of chapter 46.10 RCW not dealing with
10 registration and licensing of snowmobiles as required by RCW 46.10.210;

11 (6) Consult and participate in the scenic and recreational highway
12 system as required by chapter 47.39 RCW; and

13 (7) Develop, prepare, and distribute information relating to marine
14 oil recycling tanks and sewage holding tank pumping stations, in
15 cooperation with other departments, as required by chapter 88.02 RCW.

16 The commission has the power reasonably necessary to carry out
17 these duties.

18 **Sec. 302.** RCW 43.51.040 and 1989 c 175 s 106 are each amended to
19 read as follows:

20 The commission shall:

21 (1) Have the care, charge, control, and supervision of all parks
22 and parkways acquired or set aside by the state for park or parkway
23 purposes.

24 (2) Adopt policies, (~~promulgate~~) and adopt, issue, and enforce
25 rules pertaining to the use, care, and administration of state parks
26 and parkways. The commission shall cause a copy of the rules to be
27 kept posted in a conspicuous place in every state park to which they
28 are applicable, but failure to post or keep any rule posted shall be no
29 defense to any prosecution for the violation thereof.

30 (3) Permit the use of state parks and parkways by the public under
31 such rules as shall be adopted.

32 (4) Clear, drain, grade, seed, and otherwise improve or beautify
33 parks and parkways, and erect structures, buildings, fireplaces, and
34 comfort stations and build and maintain paths, trails, and roadways
35 through or on parks and parkways.

36 (5) Grant concessions or leases in state parks and parkways, upon
37 such rentals, fees, or percentage of income or profits and for such
38 terms, in no event longer than forty years, and upon such conditions as

1 shall be approved by the commission: PROVIDED, That leases exceeding
2 a twenty-year term shall require a unanimous vote of the commission:
3 PROVIDED FURTHER, That if, during the term of any concession or lease,
4 it is the opinion of the commission that it would be in the best
5 interest of the state, the commission may, with the consent of the
6 concessionaire or lessee, alter and amend the terms and conditions of
7 such concession or lease: PROVIDED FURTHER, That television station
8 leases shall be subject to the provisions of RCW 43.51.063 (as
9 recodified by this act), only: PROVIDED FURTHER, That the rates of
10 such concessions or leases shall be renegotiated at five-year
11 intervals. No concession shall be granted which will prevent the
12 public from having free access to the scenic attractions of any park or
13 parkway.

14 (6) Employ such assistance as it deems necessary.

15 (7) By majority vote of its authorized membership select and
16 purchase or obtain options upon, lease, or otherwise acquire for and in
17 the name of the state such tracts of land, including shore and tide
18 lands, for park and parkway purposes as it deems proper. If the
19 commission cannot acquire any tract at a price it deems reasonable, it
20 may, by majority vote of its authorized membership, obtain title
21 thereto, or any part thereof, by condemnation proceedings conducted by
22 the attorney general as provided for the condemnation of rights of way
23 for state highways. Option agreements executed under authority of this
24 subdivision shall be valid only if:

25 (a) The cost of the option agreement does not exceed one dollar;
26 and

27 (b) Moneys used for the purchase of the option agreement are from
28 (i) funds appropriated therefor, or (ii) funds appropriated for
29 undesignated land acquisitions, or (iii) funds deemed by the commission
30 to be in excess of the amount necessary for the purposes for which they
31 were appropriated; and

32 (c) The maximum amount payable for the property upon exercise of
33 the option does not exceed the appraised value of the property.

34 (8) Cooperate with the United States, or any county or city of this
35 state, in any matter pertaining to the acquisition, development,
36 redevelopment, renovation, care, control, or supervision of any park or
37 parkway, and enter into contracts in writing to that end. All parks or
38 parkways, to which the state contributed or in whose care, control, or

1 supervision the state participated pursuant to the provisions of this
2 section, shall be governed by the provisions hereof.

3 **Sec. 303.** RCW 43.51.045 and 1984 c 82 s 1 are each amended to read
4 as follows:

5 (1) The commission shall:

6 (a) Manage timber and land under its jurisdiction to maintain and
7 enhance aesthetic and recreational values;

8 (b) Apply modern conservation practices to maintain and enhance
9 aesthetic, recreational, and ecological resources; and

10 (c) Designate and preserve certain forest areas throughout the
11 state as natural forests or natural areas for interpretation, study,
12 and preservation purposes.

13 (2) Trees may be removed from state parks:

14 (a) When hazardous to persons, property, or facilities;

15 (b) As part of a park maintenance or development project, or
16 conservation practice;

17 (c) As part of a road or utility easement; or

18 (d) When damaged by a catastrophic forest event.

19 (3) Tree removal under subsection (2) of this section shall be done
20 by commission personnel, unless the personnel lack necessary expertise.
21 Except in emergencies and when feasible, significant trees shall be
22 removed only after they have been marked or appraised by a professional
23 forester. The removal of significant trees from a natural forest may
24 take place only after a public hearing has been held, except in
25 emergencies.

26 (4) When feasible, felled timber shall be left on the ground for
27 natural purposes or used for park purposes including, but not limited
28 to, building projects, trail mulching, and firewood. In natural forest
29 areas, first consideration shall be given to leaving timber on the
30 ground for natural purposes.

31 (5) The commission may issue permits to individuals under RCW
32 4.24.210 and 43.51.065 (as recodified by this act) for the removal of
33 wood debris from state parks for personal firewood use.

34 (6) Only timber that qualifies for cutting or removal under
35 subsection (2) of this section may be sold. Timber shall be sold only
36 when surplus to the needs of the park.

1 (7) Net revenue derived from timber sales shall be deposited in the
2 state parks renewal and stewardship account created in RCW 43.51.275
3 (as recodified by this act).

4 **Sec. 304.** RCW 43.51.046 and 1991 c 11 s 1 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) ~~((By July 1, 1992,))~~ The ~~((state parks and recreation))~~
7 commission shall provide waste reduction and recycling information in
8 each state park campground and day-use area.

9 (2) ~~((By July 1, 1993,))~~ The commission shall provide recycling
10 receptacles in the day-use and campground areas of at least ~~((fifteen))~~
11 forty state parks. The receptacles shall be clearly marked for the
12 disposal of at least two of the following recyclable materials:
13 Aluminum, glass, newspaper, plastic, and tin. The commission shall
14 endeavor to provide recycling receptacles in parks that are near urban
15 centers or in heavily used parks.

16 (3) The commission shall provide daily maintenance of such
17 receptacles from April through September of each year.

18 (4) ~~((Beginning July 1, 1993, the commission shall provide~~
19 ~~recycling receptacles in at least five additional state parks per~~
20 ~~biennium until the total number of state parks having recycling~~
21 ~~receptacles reaches forty.~~

22 ~~(5))~~ The commission is authorized to enter into agreements with
23 any person, company, or nonprofit organization to provide for the
24 collection and transport of recyclable materials and related activities
25 under this section.

26 **Sec. 305.** RCW 43.51.061 and 1969 ex.s. c 31 s 2 are each amended
27 to read as follows:

28 ~~((Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter or of other~~
29 ~~laws))~~ No provision of law relating to the commission~~((,))~~ shall
30 prevent the commission ~~((may delegate))~~ from delegating to the director
31 ~~((of parks and recreation))~~ such powers and duties of the commission as
32 they may deem proper.

33 **Sec. 306.** RCW 43.51.060 and 1995 c 211 s 3 are each amended to
34 read as follows:

35 The commission may:

1 (1) Make rules and regulations for the proper administration of its
2 duties;

3 (2) Accept any grants of funds made with or without a matching
4 requirement by the United States, or any agency thereof, for purposes
5 in keeping with the purposes of this chapter; accept gifts, bequests,
6 devises and endowments for purposes in keeping with such purposes;
7 enter into cooperative agreements with and provide for private
8 nonprofit groups to use state park property and facilities to raise
9 money to contribute gifts, grants, and support to the commission for
10 the purposes of this chapter. The commission may assist the nonprofit
11 group in a cooperative effort by providing necessary agency personnel
12 and services, if available. However, none of the moneys raised may
13 inure to the benefit of the nonprofit group, except in furtherance of
14 its purposes to benefit the commission as provided in this chapter.
15 The agency and the private nonprofit group shall agree on the nature of
16 any project to be supported by such gift or grant prior to the use of
17 any agency property or facilities for raising money. Any such gifts
18 may be in the form of recreational facilities developed or built in
19 part or in whole for public use on agency property, provided that the
20 facility is consistent with the purposes of the agency;

21 (3) Require certification by the commission of all parks and
22 recreation workers employed in state aided or state controlled
23 programs;

24 (4) Act jointly, when advisable, with the United States, any other
25 state agencies, institutions, departments, boards, or commissions in
26 order to carry out the objectives and responsibilities of this chapter;

27 (5) Grant franchises and easements for any legitimate purpose on
28 parks or parkways, for such terms and subject to such conditions and
29 considerations as the commission shall specify;

30 (6) Charge such fees for services, utilities, and use of facilities
31 as the commission shall deem proper;

32 (7) Enter into agreements whereby individuals or companies may rent
33 undeveloped parks or parkway land for grazing, agricultural, or mineral
34 development purposes upon such terms and conditions as the commission
35 shall deem proper, for a term not to exceed ten years;

36 (8) Determine the qualifications of and employ a director of parks
37 and recreation who shall receive a salary as fixed by the governor in
38 accordance with the provisions of RCW 43.03.040(~~(, and upon his~~
39 ~~recommendation, a supervisor of recreation,~~) and determine the

1 qualifications and salary of and employ such other persons as may be
2 needed to carry out the provisions hereof; and

3 (9) Without being limited to the powers hereinbefore enumerated,
4 the commission shall have such other powers as in the judgment of a
5 majority of its members are deemed necessary to effectuate the purposes
6 of this chapter: PROVIDED, That the commission shall not have power to
7 supervise directly any local park or recreation district, and no funds
8 shall be made available for such purpose.

9 **PART IV**

10 **DUTIES OF THE DIRECTOR**

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 401.** In addition to other duties the commission
12 may from time to time impose, it is the duty of the director to:

13 (1) Ensure the control of weeds in parks to the extent required by
14 RCW 17.04.160 and 17.10.205; and

15 (2) Participate in the operations of the environmental enhancement
16 and job creation task force under chapter 43.21J RCW.

17 The director has the power reasonably necessary to carry out these
18 duties.

19 **Sec. 402.** RCW 43.51.052 and 1997 c 137 s 2 are each amended to
20 read as follows:

21 (1) The parks improvement account is hereby established in the
22 state treasury.

23 (2) The (~~(parks and recreation)~~) commission shall deposit all
24 moneys received from the sale of interpretive, recreational, and
25 historical literature and materials in this account. Moneys in the
26 account may be spent only for development, production, and distribution
27 costs associated with literature and materials.

28 (3) Disbursements from the account shall be on the authority of the
29 director (~~(of the parks and recreation commission)~~), or the director's
30 designee. The account is subject to the allotment procedure provided
31 under chapter 43.88 RCW. No appropriation is required for disbursement
32 of moneys to be used for support of further production of materials
33 provided for in RCW 43.51.050(2) (as recodified by this act). The
34 director may transfer a portion of the moneys in this account to the
35 state parks renewal and stewardship account and may expend moneys so

1 transferred for any purpose provided for in RCW 43.51.275 (as
2 recodified by this act).

3 **PART V**

4 **PROHIBITED ACTS AND PENALTIES**

5 **Sec. 501.** RCW 46.61.587 and 1984 c 258 s 329 are each amended to
6 read as follows:

7 Any violation of RCW 43.51.320 (as recodified by this act) or
8 46.61.585 or any rule ~~((promulgated))~~ adopted by the parks and
9 recreation commission to enforce the provisions thereof ~~((shall be~~
10 ~~punished by a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars))~~ is a civil
11 infraction as provided in chapter 7.84 RCW.

12 **Sec. 502.** RCW 7.84.010 and 1993 c 244 s 2 are each amended to read
13 as follows:

14 The legislature declares that decriminalizing certain offenses
15 contained in Titles 75, 76, 77, ~~((and))~~ 79, and 79A RCW and chapters
16 43.30(~~(7-43.517)~~) and 88.12 RCW and any rules adopted pursuant to those
17 titles and chapters would promote the more efficient administration of
18 those titles and chapters. The purpose of this chapter is to provide
19 a just, uniform, and efficient procedure for adjudicating those
20 violations which, in any of these titles and chapters or rules adopted
21 under these chapters or titles, are declared not to be criminal
22 offenses. The legislature respectfully requests the supreme court to
23 prescribe any rules of procedure necessary to implement this chapter.

24 **Sec. 503.** RCW 7.84.020 and 1993 c 244 s 3 are each amended to read
25 as follows:

26 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definition in
27 this section applies throughout this chapter.

28 "Infraction" means an offense which, by the terms of Title 75, 76,
29 77, ~~((or))~~ 79, or 79A RCW or chapter 43.30(~~(7-43.517)~~) or 88.12 RCW and
30 rules adopted under these titles and chapters, is declared not to be a
31 criminal offense and is subject to the provisions of this chapter.

32 **PART VI**

33 **PROCEDURES FOR DISPOSAL OF PARK LAND**

1 **Sec. 601.** RCW 43.51.210 and 1998 c 42 s 1 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 Whenever the (~~state parks and recreation~~) commission finds that
4 any land under its control cannot advantageously be used for park
5 purposes, it is authorized to dispose of such land by the method
6 provided in this section or by the method provided in RCW 43.51.200 (as
7 recodified by this act). If such lands are school or other grant
8 lands, control thereof shall be relinquished by resolution of the
9 commission to the proper state officials. If such lands were acquired
10 under restrictive conveyances by which the state may hold them only so
11 long as they are used for park purposes, they may be returned to the
12 donor or grantors by the commission. All other such lands may be
13 either sold by the commission to the highest bidder or exchanged for
14 other lands of equal value by the commission, and all conveyance
15 documents shall be executed by the governor. All such exchanges shall
16 be accompanied by a transfer fee, to be set by the commission and paid
17 by the other party to the transfer; such fee shall be paid into the
18 parkland acquisition account established under RCW 43.51.200 as
19 recodified by this act). Sealed bids on all sales shall be solicited
20 at least twenty days in advance of the sale date by an advertisement
21 appearing at least in three consecutive issues of a newspaper of
22 general circulation in the county in which the land to be sold is
23 located. If the commission feels that no bid received adequately
24 reflects the fair value of the land to be sold, it may reject all bids,
25 and may call for new bids. All proceeds derived from the sale of such
26 park property shall be paid into the park land acquisition account.
27 All land considered for exchange shall be evaluated by the commission
28 to determine its adaptability to park usage. The equal value of all
29 lands exchanged shall first be determined by the appraisals to the
30 satisfaction of the commission: PROVIDED, That no sale or exchange of
31 state park lands shall be made without the unanimous consent of the
32 commission.

33 **PART VII**
34 **VOLUNTEERS**

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 701.** The commission shall cooperate in
36 implementing and operating the conservation corps as required by
37 chapter 43.220 RCW.

1 participating local government associated with that river or river
2 segment shall serve as a member of the committee.

3 (3) "Participating local government" means the legislative
4 authority of any city or county, a portion of whose territorial
5 jurisdiction is bounded by or includes a river or river segment of the
6 state's scenic river system.

7 (4) "River" means a flowing body of water or a section, segment, or
8 portion thereof.

9 (5) "River area" means a river and the land area in its immediate
10 environs as established by the participating agencies not exceeding a
11 width of one-quarter mile landward from the streamway on either side of
12 the river.

13 (6) "Scenic easement" means the negotiated right to control the use
14 of land, including the air space above the land, for the purpose of
15 protecting the scenic view throughout the visual corridor.

16 (7) "Streamway" means that stream-dependent corridor of single or
17 multiple, wet or dry, channel or channels within which the usual
18 seasonal or stormwater run-off peaks are contained, and within which
19 environment the flora, fauna, soil, and topography is dependent on or
20 influenced by the height and velocity of the fluctuating river
21 currents.

22 (8) "System" means all the rivers and river areas in the state
23 designated by the legislature for inclusion as scenic rivers but does
24 not include tributaries of a designated river unless specifically
25 included by the legislature. The inclusion of a river in the system
26 does not mean that other rivers or tributaries in a drainage basin
27 shall be required to be part of the management program developed for
28 the system unless the rivers and tributaries within the drainage basin
29 are specifically designated for inclusion by the legislature.

30 (9) "Visual corridor" means that area which can be seen in a normal
31 summer month by a person of normal vision walking either bank of a
32 river included in the system. The visual corridor shall not exceed the
33 river area.

34 **Sec. 802.** RCW 79.72.030 and 1977 ex.s. c 161 s 3 are each amended
35 to read as follows:

36 (1) The ((department)) commission shall develop and adopt
37 management policies for publicly owned or leased land on the rivers
38 designated by the legislature as being a part of the state's scenic

1 river system and within the associated river areas. The ((department))
2 commission may adopt ((regulations)) rules identifying river
3 classifications which reflect the characteristics common to various
4 segments of scenic rivers and may adopt management policies consistent
5 with local government's shoreline management master plans appropriate
6 for each such river classification. All such policies shall be subject
7 to review by the committee of participating agencies. Once such a
8 policy has been approved by a majority vote of the committee members,
9 it shall be adopted by the ((department)) commission in accordance with

20 system. Such policies shall also include management plans to encourage
21 any nonprofit group, organization, association, person, or corporation
22 to develop and adopt programs for the purpose of increasing fish
23 propagation.

24 (3) The committee of participating agencies shall, by two-thirds
25 majority vote, identify on a river by river basis any publicly owned or
26 leased lands which could be included in a river area of the system but
27 which are developed in a manner unsuitable for land to be managed as
28 part of the system. The ((department)) commission shall exclude lands
29 so identified from the provisions of any management policies
30 implementing the provisions of this chapter.

31 (4) The committee of participating agencies, by majority vote,
32 shall determine the boundaries which shall define the river area
33 associated with any included river. With respect to the rivers named
34 in RCW 79.72.080 (as recodified by this act), the committee shall make
35 such determination, and those determinations authorized by subsection
36 (3) of this section, within one year of September 21, 1977.

37 (5) Before making a decision regarding the river area to be
38 included in the system, a variance in policy, or the excluding of land
39 from the provisions of the management policies, the committee shall

1 hold hearings in accord with chapter 34.05 RCW, with at least one
2 public hearing to be held in the general locale of the river under
3 consideration. The ((department)) commission shall cause to be
4 published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area which
5 includes the river or rivers to be considered, a description, including
6 a map showing such river or rivers, of the material to be considered at
7 the public hearing. Such notice shall appear at least twice in the
8 time period between two and four weeks prior to the public hearing.

9 (6) Meetings of the committee shall be called by the ((department))
10 commission or by written petition signed by five or more of the
11 committee members. The ((chairman)) chair of the ((parks—and
12 recreation)) commission or the ((chairman's)) chair's designee shall
13 serve as the ((chairman)) chair of any meetings of the committee held
14 to implement the provisions of this chapter.

15 The committee shall seek and receive comments from the public
16 regarding potential additions to the system, shall initiate studies,
17 and may, through the ((department)) commission, submit to any session
18 of the legislature proposals for additions to the state scenic river
19 system. These proposals shall be accompanied by a detailed report on
20 the factors which, in the committee's judgment, make an area a worthy
21 addition to the system.

22 **Sec. 803.** RCW 79.72.040 and 1989 c 175 s 169 are each amended to
23 read as follows:

24 (1) The management program for the system shall be administered by
25 the ((department)) commission. The ((department)) commission shall
26 have the responsibility for coordinating the development of the program
27 between affected state agencies and participating local governments,
28 and shall develop and adopt rules, in accord with chapter 34.05 RCW,
29 the Administrative Procedure Act, for each portion of the system, which
30 shall implement the management policies. In developing rules for a
31 specific river in the system, the ((department)) commission shall hold

7 to approval by majority vote of the members of the committee, to: (a)
8 Purchase, within the river area, real property in fee or any lesser
9 right or interest in real property including, but not limited to scenic
10 easements and future development rights, visual corridors, wildlife
11 habitats, unique ecological areas, historical sites, camping and picnic
12 areas, boat launching sites, and/or easements abutting the river for
13 the purpose of preserving or enhancing the river or facilitating the
14 use of the river by the public for fishing, boating and other water
15 related activities; and (b) purchase, outside of a river area, public
16 access to the river area.

17 The right of eminent domain shall not be utilized in any purchase
18 made pursuant to this section.

19 (3) The ((department)) commission is further authorized to: (a)
20 Acquire by gift, devise, grant, or dedication the fee, an option to
21 purchase, a right of first refusal or any other lesser right or
22 interest in real property and upon acquisition such real property shall

24 grants, contributions, or funds from any agency, public or private, or
25 individual for the purposes of this chapter.

27 to obtain injunctions and other appropriate relief against violations
28 of any provisions of this chapter and any rules adopted under this
29 section or agreements made under the provisions of this chapter.

16 shall not be presumed to be a known dangerous artificial latent
17 condition for the purposes of this chapter.
