1 AN ACT Relating to department of social and health services family
2 planning services; reenacting and amending RCW 74.09.510; and adding a
3 new section to chapter 74.09 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 74.09 RCW
6 to read as follows:

7 The department may, upon receipt of approval from the federal
8 health care financing administration, implement a waiver under section
9 1115 of the federal social security act to provide family planning
10 services to persons with family incomes at or below two hundred percent
11 of the federal poverty level. For purposes of this section, family
12 planning services includes all federal food and drug administration-
13 approved contraceptives, sterilization services, and medical services
14 associated with use of contraceptive and sterilization services, social
15 services, interpretive services, and comprehensive educational
16 services, including abstinence education, necessary to aid individuals
17 to avoid unintended pregnancy.

1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 74.09.510 and 1997 c 59 s 14 and 1997 c 58 s 201 are
2 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

3 Medical assistance may be provided in accordance with eligibility
4 requirements established by the department, as defined in the social
5 security Title XIX state plan for mandatory categorically needy persons
6 and: (1) Individuals who would be eligible for cash assistance except
7 for their institutional status; (2) individuals who are under twenty-
8 one years of age, who would be eligible for temporary assistance for
9 needy families or medicaid, but do not qualify as dependent children
10 and who are in (a) foster care, (b) subsidized adoption, (c) a nursing
11 facility or an intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded, or
12 (d) inpatient psychiatric facilities; (3) the aged, blind, and disabled
13 who: (a) Receive only a state supplement, or (b) would not be eligible
14 for cash assistance if they were not institutionalized; (4)
15 categorically eligible individuals who meet the income and resource
16 requirements of the cash assistance programs; (5) individuals who are
17 enrolled in managed health care systems, who have otherwise lost
18 eligibility for medical assistance, but who have not completed a
19 current six-month enrollment in a managed health care system, and who
20 are eligible for federal financial participation under Title XIX of the
21 social security act; (6) children and pregnant women allowed by federal
22 statute for whom funding is appropriated; (7) other individuals
23 eligible for medical services under RCW 74.09.035 (~~and~~), 74.09.700,
24 and section 1 of this act for whom federal financial participation is
25 available under Title XIX of the social security act; and (8) persons
26 allowed by section 1931 of the social security act for whom funding is
27 appropriated.

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
