
SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5467

1 AN ACT Relating to the time limit on regular tax levies for medical
2 care and services; amending RCW 84.52.069; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 84.52.069 and 1995 c 318 s 9 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) As used in this section, "taxing district" means a county,
7 emergency medical service district, city or town, public hospital
8 district, urban emergency medical service district, or fire protection
9 district.

10 (2) A taxing district may impose additional regular property tax
11 levies in an amount equal to fifty cents or less per thousand dollars
12 of the assessed value of property in the taxing district in each year
13 for ((~~six~~)) ten consecutive years when specifically authorized so to do
14 by a majority of at least three-fifths of the registered voters thereof
15 approving a proposition authorizing the levies submitted at a general
16 or special election, at which election the number of persons voting
17 "yes" on the proposition shall constitute three-fifths of a number
18 equal to forty percent of the total number of voters voting in such
19 taxing district at the last preceding general election when the number

1 of registered voters voting on the proposition does not exceed forty
2 percent of the total number of voters voting in such taxing district in
3 the last preceding general election; or by a majority of at least
4 three-fifths of the registered voters thereof voting on the proposition
5 when the number of registered voters voting on the proposition exceeds
6 forty percent of the total number of voters voting in such taxing
7 district in the last preceding general election. Ballot propositions
8 shall conform with RCW 29.30.111.

9 (3) Any tax imposed under this section shall be used only for the
10 provision of emergency medical care or emergency medical services,
11 including related personnel costs, training for such personnel, and
12 related equipment, supplies, vehicles and structures needed for the
13 provision of emergency medical care or emergency medical services.

14 (4) If a county levies a tax under this section, no taxing district
15 within the county may levy a tax under this section. No other taxing
16 district may levy a tax under this section if another taxing district
17 has levied a tax under this section within its boundaries: PROVIDED,
18 That if a county levies less than fifty cents per thousand dollars of
19 the assessed value of property, then any other taxing district may levy
20 a tax under this section equal to the difference between the rate of
21 the levy by the county and fifty cents: PROVIDED FURTHER, That if a
22 taxing district within a county levies this tax, and the voters of the
23 county subsequently approve a levying of this tax, then the amount of
24 the taxing district levy within the county shall be reduced, when the
25 combined levies exceed fifty cents. Whenever a tax is levied county-
26 wide, the service shall, insofar as is feasible, be provided throughout
27 the county: PROVIDED FURTHER, That no county-wide levy proposal may be
28 placed on the ballot without the approval of the legislative authority
29 of each city exceeding fifty thousand population within the county:
30 AND PROVIDED FURTHER, That this section and RCW 36.32.480 shall not
31 prohibit any city or town from levying an annual excess levy to fund
32 emergency medical services: AND PROVIDED, FURTHER, That if a county
33 proposes to impose tax levies under this section, no other ballot
34 proposition authorizing tax levies under this section by another taxing
35 district in the county may be placed before the voters at the same
36 election at which the county ballot proposition is placed: AND
37 PROVIDED FURTHER, That any taxing district emergency medical service
38 levy that is authorized subsequent to a county emergency medical

1 service levy, shall expire concurrently with the county emergency
2 medical service levy.

3 (5) The limitations in RCW 84.52.043 shall not apply to the tax
4 levy authorized in this section.

5 (6) The limitation in RCW 84.55.010 shall not apply to the first
6 levy imposed pursuant to this section following the approval of such
7 levy by the voters pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** This act applies to levies authorized after
9 the effective date of this section.

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
