- 1 AN ACT Relating to contraceptive health care benefits; adding a new
- 2 section to chapter 48.43 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. The legislature finds that: (1) Over half NEW SECTION. 5 of all pregnancies are unintended; (2) by reducing rates of unintended pregnancy, contraceptives help reduce the need for abortion; (3) 6 unintended pregnancies lead to higher rates of infant mortality, low birth weight, and maternal morbidity, and threaten the economic 8 viability of families; (4) contraceptive services are part of basic 9 10 health care, allowing families to both adequately space desired pregnancies and avoid unintended pregnancy; (5) many health carriers 11 12 prescription drugs and devices but exclude prescription 13 contraceptives and contraceptive devices; (6) women of child-bearing 14 age spend significantly more than men on out-of-pocket health care 15 costs, with contraceptives and reproductive health care services accounting for most of this disparity; (7) lack of contraceptive 16 17 coverage in health plans places many effective forms of contraceptives beyond the financial reach of many women, leading to unintended 18 pregnancies; and (8) the ability to plan her childbearing is central to 19

- 1 a woman's ability to participate on an equal basis in education and 2 employment.
- The legislature intends to reduce the number of unintended pregnancies and ensure access to contraceptive services in health plans
- 5 that cover prescription drugs and outpatient health services. The
- 6 legislature also intends to further the goal of eliminating sex
- 7 discrimination in health benefits for women.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 48.43 RCW 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (1) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this 11 section unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 12 (a) "Prescription contraceptive drugs and devices" includes 13 prescription contraceptive drugs and devices approved by the federal
- 14 food and drug administration, including oral contraceptives,
- 15 intrauterine devices (IUDs), injectables, hormonal implants,
- 16 diaphragms, cervical caps, and emergency contraception.
- (b) "Outpatient contraceptive services" means services necessary
  18 for the effective use of contraception, including family planning
  19 counseling, exams for inserting, removing, or dispensing prescription
- 20 contraceptive methods, and laboratory services.
- 21 (2) A health plan issued to individuals or groups shall not exclude 22 or restrict an enrollee's access to:
- (a) Prescription contraceptive drugs and devices approved by the federal food and drug administration if the plan provides benefits for prescription drugs; or
- 26 (b) Outpatient contraceptive services, if the plan provides 27 benefits for outpatient health services.
- (3) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, a health carrier shall not create or impose disincentives for utilization of the benefits required by subsection (2) of this section.
- 31 (4) Nothing in this section shall be construed as:
- 32 (a) Preventing a health carrier from imposing deductibles, 33 coinsurance, other cost-sharing requirements, or other limitations in 34 relation to providing prescription contraceptive drugs and devices, or 35 outpatient contraceptive services, provided that the deductible, 36 coinsurance, other cost-sharing requirement, or other limitation is not 37 greater than or different from the deductible, coinsurance, other cost-

- sharing requirement, or other limitation for other prescription drugs,
- devices, or outpatient health care services covered under the plan; or 2
- 3 (b) Requiring a health plan to cover experimental or investigative 4
- prescription contraceptive drugs and devices, or outpatient
- contraceptive services, except to the extent that the plan provides 5 coverage for other experimental or investigative prescription drugs, 6
- devices, or outpatient health care services.
- 8 (5) This section applies to health plans issued or renewed on or
- 9 after the effective date of this section.
- 10 Sec. 3. If any provision of this act or its NEW SECTION.
- application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, 11
- 12 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- persons or circumstances is not affected. 13
