1 AN ACT Relating to compensation for certificated instructional
2 staff; creating a new section; making appropriations; providing an
3 effective date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1. FOR THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC**
6 **INSTRUCTION--BASIC EDUCATION CERTIFICATED INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF**
7 **COMPENSATION.** (1) Salary allocations for certificated instructional
8 staff units shall be determined for each district by multiplying the
9 district's certificated instructional derived base salary shown on LEAP
10 Document 12E, by the district's average staff mix factor for basic
11 education and special education certificated instructional staff in
12 that school year, computed using LEAP Document 1B.

13 (2) For the purposes of this section:

14 (a) "Basic education certificated instructional staff" is defined
15 as provided in RCW 28A.150.100 and "special education certificated
16 staff" means staff assigned to the state-supported special education
17 program pursuant to chapter 28A.155 RCW in positions requiring a
18 certificate;

1 (b) "LEAP Document 1B" means the computerized tabulation
 2 establishing staff mix factors for certificated instructional staff
 3 according to education and years of experience, as developed by the
 4 legislative evaluation and accountability program committee on January
 5 25, 1999, at 15:45 hours; and

6 (c) "LEAP Document 12E" means the computerized tabulation of 1999-
 7 00 and 2000-01 school year salary allocations for derived base salaries
 8 for certificated instructional staff as developed by the legislative
 9 evaluation and accountability program committee on January 25, 1999, at
 10 16:25 hours.

11 (3) Incremental fringe benefit factors shall be applied to salary
 12 adjustments at a rate of 16.22 percent for certificated staff and 12.20
 13 percent for classified staff for both years of the biennium.

14 (4)(a) Pursuant to RCW 28A.150.410, the following state-wide salary
 15 allocation schedules for certificated instructional staff are
 16 established for basic education salary allocations:

18 (b) As used in this subsection, the column headings "BA+(N)" refer
19 to the number of credits earned since receiving the baccalaureate
20 degree.

21 (c) For credits earned after the baccalaureate degree but before
22 the masters degree, any credits in excess of forty-five credits may be
23 counted after the masters degree. Thus, as used in this subsection,
24 the column headings "MA+(N)" refer to the total of:

- 25 (i) Credits earned since receiving the masters degree; and
- 26 (ii) Any credits in excess of forty-five credits that were earned
27 after the baccalaureate degree but before the masters degree.

28 (5) For the purposes of this section:

- 29 (a) "BA" means a baccalaureate degree;
- 30 (b) "MA" means a masters degree;
- 31 (c) "PHD" means a doctorate degree;
- 32 (d) "Years of service" shall be calculated under the same rules
33 adopted by the superintendent of public instruction;

34 (e) "Credits" means college quarter-hour credits and equivalent
35 in-service credits computed in accordance with RCW 28A.415.020 and
36 chapter 90, Laws of 1997.

37 (6) No more than ninety college quarter-hour credits received by
38 any employee after the baccalaureate degree may be used to determine

1 compensation allocations under the state salary allocation schedule and
2 LEAP documents referenced in this act, or any replacement schedules and
3 documents, unless:

4 (a) The employee has a masters degree; or

5 (b) The credits were used in generating state salary allocations
6 before January 1, 1992.

7 (7) The salary allocation schedules established in this section
8 are for allocation purposes only except as provided in RCW
9 28A.400.200(2).

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2. FOR THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC**
11 **INSTRUCTION--FOR CERTIFICATED INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF COMPENSATION**
12 **ADJUSTMENTS**

16 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
17 conditions and limitations:

18 (1) \$193,193,000 is provided for a cost-of-living adjustment of
19 3.0 percent effective September 1, 1999, and another 3.0 percent
20 effective September 1, 2000, for state formula certificated
21 instructional staff units. The appropriations include associated
22 incremental fringe benefit allocations at rates of 16.22 percent. The
23 appropriations in this section include the increased portion of
24 salaries and incremental fringe benefits for all relevant state-funded
25 school programs.

26 (2) \$55,405,000 is provided to adjust the salary allocation
27 schedule to provide for salary increases for staff in the first eight
28 rows of the salary schedule as reflected in the salary schedules
29 contained in section 1 of this act. The appropriations in this section
30 include the increased portion of salaries and incremental fringe
31 benefits for all relevant state-funded school programs.

32 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
33 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the

1 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
2 July 1, 1999.

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
