- AN ACT Relating to "Help Kids Speak" license plates; amending RCW 46.16.301 and 46.16.313; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW;
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 46.16 RCW; adding a new section to
- 4 chapter 28A.300 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature recognizes that good
- 7 language skills are essential for productive adults and that public
- 8 schools in the state of Washington provide trained speech pathologists
- 9 to assist children who lack adequate verbal communication skills to
- 10 compete successfully in the challenges of securing an education. I
- 11 recognizes that the task of teaching students to speak well is a
- 12 formidable one and sees shrinking public funding as an obstacle in
- 13 providing sufficient professional staff to realize that goal. It
- 14 further recognizes that professionally trained and licensed speech
- 15 pathologists are provided at no cost by nonprofit charitable
- 16 organizations to preschool and school-age children. To aid the public
- 17 schools in teaching essential speech skills, a "Help Kids Speak"
- 18 license plate is established.

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- 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.16.301 and 1997 c 291 s 5 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 (1) The department shall create, design, and issue a special 4 baseball stadium license plate that may be used in lieu of regular or personalized license plates for motor vehicles required to display two 5 motor vehicle license plates, excluding vehicles registered under 6 7 chapter 46.87 RCW, upon terms and conditions established by the 8 department. The special plates shall commemorate the construction of 9 a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485. The department shall 10 also issue to each recipient of a special baseball stadium license plate a certificate of participation in the construction of the 11 baseball stadium. 12
- (2) In cooperation with the Washington state patrol and the 13 14 department of licensing, the sponsors of the "Help Kids Speak" program shall create, and design, and the department shall issue a special 15 license plate displaying a symbol of a nonprofit charitable 16 organization and the words "Help Kids Speak" that may be used in lieu 17 of regular or personalized license plates for motor vehicles required 18 19 to display two motor vehicle license plates, excluding vehicles registered under chapter 46.87 RCW, upon terms and conditions 20 established by the department. The special plates will commemorate the 21 "Help Kids Speak" organization. 22
- 23 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.16.313 and 1997 c 291 s 8 are each amended to read 24 as follows:
- 25 (1) The department may establish a fee for each type of special 26 license plates issued under RCW 46.16.301(1) (a), (b), or (c), as 27 existing before amendment by section 5, chapter 291, Laws of 1997, in an amount calculated to offset the cost of production of the special 28 29 license plates and the administration of this program. 30 December 31, 1997,)) The fee shall not exceed ((thirty-five dollars, but effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on 31 32 January 1, 1998, the department may adjust the fee to no more than)) 33 forty dollars. This fee is in addition to all other fees required to 34 register and license the vehicle for which the plates have been requested. All such additional special license plate fees collected by 35 36 the department shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to 37 the motor vehicle fund.

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(2) ((Until December 31, 1997, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application, registration, and renewal registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a collegiate license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds, minus the cost of plate production, shall be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in RCW 28B.10.890.

 (3) Effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on January 1, 1998,)) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a collegiate license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in RCW 28B.10.890.

((4+))) (3) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January 1, ((1999)) 2000, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a collegiate license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in RCW 28B.10.890.

(((5))) (4) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a special baseball stadium license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds, minus the cost of plate production, shall be distributed to

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a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments 2 on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as 3 RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably defined 4 preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds 5 to the state general fund. 6

7 (((6))) (5) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on 8 January 1, ((1999)) 2000, in addition to all fees and taxes required to 9 be paid upon renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a 10 special baseball stadium license plate shall pay a fee of thirty The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two 11 dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration 12 and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall 13 be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and 14 15 interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball 16 stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary 17 preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds 18 19 to the state general fund.

(6) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a "Help <u>Kids Speak" license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty dollars.</u> The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds, minus the cost of plate production, shall be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall remit the proceeds to the superintendent of public instruction for grants under section 6 of this act to aid public schools in providing essential speaking skills to youngsters of the state of Washington.

(7) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January 32 1, 2001, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 33 34 renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a "Help Kids Speak" license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected 36 37 under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to the 38 39 custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed

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- 1 report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the "Help Kids
- 2 Speak" license plate fund as provided in chapter 28A.300 RCW.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW 4 to read as follows:
- 5 "Help Kids Speak license plates" means license plates that display
- 6 a symbol of a nonprofit, charitable organization that provides no-fee
- 7 professional speech pathologists to teach youngsters to speak.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 46.16 RCW 9 to read as follows:
- 10 Beginning not later than January 1, 2001, the department shall
- 11 issue license plates depicting a symbol of a nonprofit, charitable
- 12 organization and the words "Help Kids Speak." Following the initial
- 13 issue, the department may renew license plates eighteen months prior to
- 14 their expiration date.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
- 16 RCW to read as follows:
- 17 (1) The "Help Kids Speak" program is created. The purpose of the
- 18 program is to provide grants to nonprofit, charitable organizations,
- 19 incorporated under the laws of the state of Washington that do not
- 20 discriminate in any way, and that provide licensed speech pathologists
- 21 on a no-fee basis to youngsters, regardless of their economic status,
- 22 whether enrolled in a public, private, or home school, of preschool or
- 23 school age, and who have displayed a lack of verbal communication
- 24 skills; including in the grant application a finding that there is, on
- 25 staff of the nonprofit, charitable organization, licensed speech
- 26 pathologists trained in the techniques of teaching youngsters essential
- 27 communication skills.
- 28 (2) The "Help Kids Speak" license plate fund is established in the
- 29 custody of the state treasurer for all receipts, except as provided in
- 30 RCW 46.16.313(6), from "Help Kids Speak" license plates. The proceeds
- 31 shall be used to fund the grant program under subsection (1) of this
- 32 section. The state treasurer shall remit the proceeds on a quarterly
- 33 basis to the superintendent of public instruction.

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
