- 1 AN ACT Relating to studying global climate change; creating new

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. The legislature finds that there is NEW SECTION. 5 increasing evidence of climate disruption. The potential effects of this change could include extraordinary heat waves, persistent drought-6 driven forest fires, increases in the frequency and severity of storms and storm damage, and warming of the earth's surface. 8 growing consensus among scientists 9 that human activities 10 influencing climate. While the probable causes of climate change are occurring on a global scale, it is likely there will be effects 11 12 specific to the Pacific Northwest region. The potential effects have 13 social, economic, and ecological dimensions and include effects on 14 energy supply and demand, resource economies and industries such as 15 forestry, fishing and agriculture, hydrology and water resources, 16 community infrastructure, emergency services, aquatic ecosystems, human 17 health, recreation opportunities, insurance, transportation, coastal activities, and urban settlements. The study shall include: (a) A review of the scientific information on climate disruption and 8 9 potential climate change; (b) a review of research findings by the national assessment of the consequences of climate variability and 10 change, Pacific Northwest region; (c) an evaluation of the potential 11 12 effects on the Pacific Northwest region and Washington of potential climate change scenarios; (d) development and evaluation of potential 13

- 16 (2) A committee is established to advise the institute for public policy in the conduct of the study described in subsection (1) of this 17 18 section. The committee shall consist of: (a) Four members of the 19 house of representatives, two from each major caucus, appointed by the co-speakers of the house of representatives; (b) four members of the 20 21 senate, two from each major caucus appointed by the president of the 22 senate; (c) four members of the public appointed by the governor; and 23 (d) a representative of the joint institute for the study of the 24 atmosphere and ocean, climate impacts group at the University of 25 Washington.
 - (3) In conducting the study, the institute for public policy shall cooperate with education and government entities in the state that have expertise and understanding related to the effects of climate change on the region and the state. These entities include, but are not limited to, public and private universities, the department of ecology, the department of community, trade, and economic development, the department of agriculture, and the department of natural resources.
