1 AN ACT Relating to state parks; and adding a new chapter to Title
2 79A RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that:

5 (1) State parks are a valuable asset to the people of the state of
6 Washington, contributing to their health, education, and well-being;

7 (2) Well maintained state parks are an attraction and contribute
8 significantly to the economic well-being of the state of Washington;

9 (3) Well maintained state parks encourage the appreciation of the
10 natural resources and natural beauty of the state of Washington;

11 (4) There is an increasing demand for more state parks and more
12 state parks services;

13 (5) There are individuals and groups who desire to contribute to
14 the continued vitality of the state parks system;

15 (6) Providing a tax-deductible method for individuals and groups to
16 contribute is an effective way of increasing available funds to improve
17 the state parks system; and

18 (7) It is in the public interest to create a nonprofit foundation
19 to provide such a method for individuals and groups to contribute to

1 the preservation, restoration, and enhancement of the state parks
2 system.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** The purpose of the Washington state parks
4 gift foundation is to encourage monetary gifts to support and improve
5 the state parks.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** The definitions in this section apply
7 throughout this chapter, unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

8 (1) "Foundation" means the Washington state parks gift foundation,
9 created in section 4 of this act.

10 (2) "State parks" means that system of parks administered by the
11 commission under this title.

12 (3) "Eligible grant recipients" includes any and all of the
13 activities of the commission in carrying out the provisions of this
14 title.

15 (4) "Eligible projects" means any project, action, or part of any
16 project or action that serves to preserve, restore, improve, or enhance
17 the state parks.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** (1) By September 1, 2000, the governor shall
19 file articles of incorporation in accordance with the Washington
20 nonprofit corporation act, chapter 24.03 RCW, to establish the
21 Washington state parks gift foundation. The foundation shall not be an
22 agency, instrumentality, or political subdivision of the state and
23 shall not disburse public funds.

24 (2) The foundation shall have a board of directors consisting of
25 seven members. Members of the board shall be appointed by the governor
26 and collectively have experience in business, charitable giving,
27 outdoor recreation, and parks administration. Initial appointments
28 shall be made by September 30, 2000.

29 (3) Members of the board shall serve three-year terms, except for
30 the initial terms, which shall be staggered by the governor to achieve
31 a balanced mix of terms on the board. Members of the board may serve
32 up to a maximum of three terms. At the end of a term, a member may
33 continue to serve until a successor has been appointed.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** (1) As soon as practicable, the board of
35 directors shall organize themselves and the foundation suitably to

1 carry out the duties of the foundation, including achieving federal
2 tax-exempt status.

3 (2) The foundation shall actively solicit contributions from
4 individuals and groups for the benefit of the state parks.

5 (3) The foundation shall develop criteria for guiding themselves in
6 either the creation of an endowment, or the making of grants to
7 eligible grant recipients and eligible projects in the state parks, or
8 both.

9 (4) A competitive grant process shall be conducted at least
10 annually by the foundation to award funds to the state parks.
11 Competitive grant applications shall only be submitted to the
12 foundation by the commission. The process shall be started as soon as
13 practicable. Grants shall be awarded to eligible projects consistent
14 with the criteria developed by the foundation and shall be available
15 only for state parks use on eligible projects.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** Money provided to the state parks by the
17 foundation shall not be used to supplant preexisting funding sources.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7.** If any provision of this act or its
19 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
20 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
21 persons or circumstances is not affected.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** Sections 1 through 7 of this act constitute
23 a new chapter in Title 79A RCW.

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
