1 AN ACT Relating to transportation funding and appropriations;
2 amending 1999 sp.s. c 1 ss 1, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105, 201, 202, 203,
3 204, 205, 206, 207, 208, 209, 210, 211, 212, 213, 214, 215, 216, 217,
4 218, 219, 220, 221, 222, 223, 224, 225, 226, 227, 228, 229, 230, 231,
5 303, 401, 402, 403, and 407 (uncodified); adding new sections to 1999
6 sp.s. c 1 (uncodified); creating a new section; repealing RCW
7 47.08.125; making appropriations; and declaring an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

9 **Sec. 1.** 1999 sp.s. c 1 s 1 (uncodified) is amended to read as
10 follows:

11 (1) The transportation budget of the state is hereby adopted and,
12 subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth, the several amounts
13 hereinafter specified, or as much thereof as may be necessary to
14 accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby appropriated from the
15 several accounts and funds hereinafter named to the designated state
16 agencies and offices for employee compensation and other expenses, for
17 capital projects, and for other specified purposes, including the
18 payment of any final judgments arising out of such activities, for the
19 period ending June 30, 2001.

1 (2) Legislation with fiscal impacts enacted in the 1997 or 1998
2 legislative session not assumed in this act are not funded in the 1997-
3 99 transportation budget.

4 (3) Legislation with fiscal impacts enacted in the 1999 legislative
5 session not assumed in this act are not funded in the 1999-01
6 transportation budget.

7 (4) Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions
8 in this subsection apply throughout this act.

9 (a) "Fiscal year 2000" or "FY 2000" means the fiscal year ending
10 June 30, 2000.

11 (b) "Fiscal year 2001" or "FY 2001" means the fiscal year ending
12 June 30, 2001.

13 (c) "FTE" means full-time equivalent.

14 (d) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
15 unappropriated status.

16 (e) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only
17 for the specified purpose. Unless otherwise specifically authorized in
18 this act, any portion of an amount provided solely for a specified
19 purpose which is unnecessary to fulfill the specified purpose shall
20 lapse.

21 (f) "Provided for" means the agency may apportion the specified
22 amount among identified uses as the director or secretary deems most
23 prudent.

24 (g) "Performance-based budgeting" means a budget that bases
25 resource needs on quantified outcomes and results expected from use of
26 the total appropriation. "Performance-based budgeting" does not mean
27 incremental budgeting that focuses on justifying changes from the
28 historic budget or to line-item input-driven budgets.

29 (~~(g)~~) (h) "Goals" means the statements of purpose that identify
30 a desired result or outcome. The statements shall be realistic,
31 achievable, directive, assignable, evaluative, and logically linked to
32 the agency's mission and statutory mandate.

33 (~~(h)~~) (i) "Strategic plan" means the strategies agencies create
34 for investment choices in the future. All agency strategic plans shall
35 present alternative investment strategies for providing services.

36 (j) "Enacted in the form passed by the legislature" means the
37 referenced bill, as identified by a four-digit number, was:

1 (i) Passed by the legislature and enacted either with no provisions
2 vetoed by the governor or with only ministerial or de minimus changes
3 resulting from a partial veto; or

4 (ii) Attached in full onto another bill as an amendment and the
5 entire bill, including the amendment, was passed by the legislature and
6 enacted either with no provisions vetoed by the governor or with only
7 ministerial or de minimus changes resulting from a partial veto.

(b) The law enforcement agency of the city or county government shall plainly mark the locations where the automated traffic enforcement system is used by placing signs on street locations that clearly indicate to a driver that he or she is entering a zone where traffic laws are enforced by an automated traffic enforcement system;

(c) Cities and counties using traffic safety cameras must provide periodic notice by mail to its citizens indicating the zones in which the traffic safety cameras will be used;

(d) Notices of infractions must be mailed to the registered owner of a vehicle within fourteen days of the infraction occurring;

(e) The owner of the vehicle is not responsible for the violation if the owner of the vehicle, within fifteen days after notification of

1 the violation, furnishes the officials or agents of the municipality
2 that issued the citation with:

3 (i) An affidavit made under oath, stating that the vehicle involved
4 was, at the time, stolen or in the care, custody, or control of some
5 person other than the registered owner; or

6 (ii) Testimony in open court under oath that the person was not the
7 operator of the vehicle at the time of the alleged violation;

8 (f) Infractions detected through the use of traffic safety cameras
9 are not part of the registered owner's driving record under RCW
10 46.52.101 and 46.52.120;

11 (g) By January 1, 2001, the traffic safety commission shall provide
12 a report to the legislature regarding the use, public acceptance,
13 outcomes, and other relevant issues regarding traffic safety cameras
14 demonstrated by the pilot projects.
