- 1 AN ACT Relating to a review of liquor control board functions; and
- 2 creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) A citizen's review panel is created to
- 5 develop specific policy recommendations concerning options for
- 6 privatization of the functions of the Washington state liquor control
- 7 board. The review panel will consist of nineteen members appointed by
- 8 the governor. The governor shall appoint representatives from the
- 9 following groups to serve on the panel:
- 10 (a) Two management experts from the private sector;
- 11 (b) One citizen from eastern Washington and one citizen from
- 12 western Washington;
- 13 (c) One representative from each of the following groups: Liquor
- 14 retailers, liquor distributors, and liquor manufacturers;
- (d) Two representatives from state liquor store employees;
- 16 (e) Two representatives from law enforcement;
- 17 (f) Two representatives from local governments;
- 18 (g) Two representatives from county health agencies;
- 19 (h) Two representatives from retail liquor licensees;

- 1 (i) One representative from the liquor control board;
- 2 (j) One representative from the office of the governor.
- 3 (2) When developing options for privatization the citizen's review 4 panel shall consider:
- 5 (a) The differences between the state liquor stores and agency 6 liquor stores and whether they merit different treatment;
- 7 (b) Whether all functions of the liquor control board should be 8 privatized or whether only some of the functions of the board should be 9 privatized;
- 10 (c) What the impact of privatization will be on state employees, 11 liquor sales, state liquor revenues and taxes, liquor prices, and 12 liquor availability.
- 13 (3) The panel shall elect a chair, hire necessary staff, and determine the staff's duties and compensation. The Washington state 15 liquor control board shall be the fiscal agent for the panel. The panel shall produce a report and make specific policy recommendations to the legislature by December 1, 2000.
