1 AN ACT Relating to supplemental tuition fees for higher education
2 programs; and amending RCW 28B.15.110.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.110 and 1977 ex.s. c 126 s 1 are each amended
5 to read as follows:

6 Where students at any of the four year state colleges or
7 universities participate in a joint program undertaken by two or more
8 of such institutions, and which leads to a degree, the tuition and fees
9 assessed each student participating in such joint program shall be
10 equal.

11 The governing board at each state four year institution shall,
12 where the tuition and fees which it charges resident students
13 participating in a joint program falling within the scope of this
14 section would be less than those charged to any such students from any
15 other state four year institution who participates in such joint
16 program, impose a supplemental fee upon its resident students so
17 participating in order to make the tuition and fees charged to them
18 equal to the highest amount charged to any other resident student from
19 a state four year institution who participates in the program. Such

1 governing board shall, where the tuition and fees which it charges
2 nonresident students participating in a joint program falling within
3 the scope of this section would be less than those charged to any such
4 students participating from any other state four year institution who
5 participates in such joint program, impose a supplemental fee upon its
6 nonresident students so participating in order to make the tuition and
7 fees charged to them equal to the highest amount charged to any other
8 nonresident student from a state four year institution who participates
9 in the program.

10 The tuition charged students enrolled in the cooperative computer
11 engineering program offered jointly by Washington State University,
12 Gonzaga University, and the University of Idaho shall be equal for all
13 students in the program from each of the institutions, as negotiated by
14 the participating institutions. The board of regents of Washington
15 State University shall charge its students who participate in the
16 cooperative computer engineering program offered by Gonzaga University,
17 the University of Idaho, and Washington State University a supplemental
18 fee so that the tuition and fees charged them are equal to the tuition
19 charged by Gonzaga University for its students enrolled in the program.
