SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 8218

State of Washington 56th Legislature 2000 1st Special Session

By Senators Patterson, Gardner, Kline, Franklin, Kohl-Welles, Goings, Haugen and T. Sheldon

Read first time 03/16/2000. Referred to Committee on State & Local Government.

- BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON, IN LEGISLATIVE SESSION ASSEMBLED:
- 3 THAT, At the next general election to be held in this state the 4 secretary of state shall submit to the qualified voters of the state 5 for their approval and ratification, or rejection, an amendment to 6 Article II, section 10 of the Constitution of the state of Washington
- 7 to read as follows:
- Article II, section 10. Each house shall elect its own officers(($\dot{\tau}$ 9 and)).
- 10 When the lieutenant governor shall not attend as president, or 11 shall act as governor, the senate shall choose a temporary president.
- 12 When presiding, the lieutenant governor shall have the deciding vote in
- 13 case of an equal division of the senate.
- 14 When no candidate for presiding officer of the house of
- 15 representatives receives a majority vote of the entire membership of
- 16 the house of representatives, the secretary of state shall serve as
- 17 presiding officer of the house of representatives. When presiding, the
- 18 secretary of state shall have no vote unless the house of
- 19 representatives is equally divided, including organizational matters
- 20 and final passage of bills, and shall be counted as a member of the
- 21 house of representatives for the purpose of determining a majority

- 1 under Article II, section 22 in such matters. While acting as
- 2 presiding officer of the house of representatives, all statutory duties
- 3 of the presiding officer shall be performed by the secretary of state.
- 4 Article III, section 17. The secretary of state shall keep a
- 5 record of the official acts of the legislature, and executive
- 6 department of the state, and shall, when required, lay the same, and
- 7 all matters relative thereto, before either branch of the legislature,
- 8 and shall perform such other duties as shall be assigned him or her by
- 9 law. ((He shall receive an annual salary of twenty-five hundred
- 10 dollars, which may be increased by the legislature, but shall never
- 11 exceed three thousand dollars per annum.))
- 12 The secretary of state shall be the presiding officer of the house
- 13 of representatives when authorized by Article II, section 10.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this amendment is a single amendment
- 15 within the meaning of Article XXIII, section 1 of the state
- 16 Constitution.
- 17 The legislature finds that the changes contained in this amendment
- 18 constitute a single integrated plan for determining the presiding
- 19 officer for the house of representatives. If this amendment is held to
- 20 be separate amendments, this joint resolution is void in its entirety
- 21 and is of no further force and effect.
- 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the secretary of state shall cause
- 23 notice of this constitutional amendment to be published at least four
- 24 times during the four weeks next preceding the election in every legal
- 25 newspaper in the state.
