- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.70.280 and 1998 c 29 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The secretary, in consultation with health profession boards
- 7 and commissions, shall establish by rule the administrative procedures,
- 8 administrative requirements, and fees for initial issue, renewal, and
- 9 reissue of a credential for professions under RCW 18.130.040, including
- 10 procedures and requirements for late renewals and uniform application
- 11 of late renewal penalties. Failure to renew invalidates the credential

(2) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary which 3 4 provides for a licensing period for any type of license subject to this chapter including those under RCW 18.130.040, the secretary of health 5 may, from time to time, extend or otherwise modify the duration of any 6 7 licensing, certification, or registration period, whether an initial or 8 renewal period, if the secretary determines that it would result in a 9 more economical or efficient operation of state government and that the 10 public health, safety, or welfare would not be substantially adversely affected thereby. However, no license, certification, or registration 11 may be issued or approved for a period in excess of four years, without 12 Such extension, reduction, or other modification of a 13 renewal. licensing, certification, or registration period shall be by rule or 14 regulation of the department of health adopted in accordance with the 15 provisions of chapter 34.05 RCW. Such rules and regulations may 16 provide a method for imposing and collecting such additional 17 proportional fee as may be required for the extended or modified 18 19 period.

(((3) Unless extended by the legislature, effective March 1, 1999, the authority of the secretary to establish administrative procedures and administrative requirements for initial issue, renewal, and reissue of a credential, including procedures and requirements for late renewals and uniform application of late renewal penalties, shall cease to apply to those health professions otherwise regulated by a board or commission with statutory rule making authority. If not extended by the legislature, such authority shall transfer to the respective board or commission. Rules adopted by the secretary under this section shall remain in effect after March 1, 1999, until modified or repealed in accordance with the provisions of chapter 34.05 RCW.))
