- 1 AN ACT Relating to local economic development cooperatives;
- 2 amending RCW 43.63A.075; and adding a new section to chapter 43.330
- 3 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.63A.075 and 1993 c 280 s 59 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 The department shall establish a community development finance
- 8 program. Pursuant to this program, the department shall, in
- 9 cooperation with the local economic development council: (1) Develop
- 10 expertise in federal, state, and local community and economic
- 11 development programs; and (2) assist communities and businesses to
- 12 secure available financing. To the extent permitted by federal law,
- 13 the department is encouraged to use federal community block grant funds
- 14 to make urban development action grants to communities which have not
- 15 been eligible to receive such grants prior to June 30, 1984.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.330 RCW
- 17 to read as follows:

- 1 (1) There is established in the department a grant program to 2 support business recruitment efforts. The purpose of the program is to 3 assist local associate development organizations in business 4 recruitment efforts by providing grants to assist in marketing the area 5 to businesses on a national and international basis.
 - (2) Applications for funding under this section must:
- 7 (a) Be submitted by either a local associate development 8 organization or a consortium of associate development organizations;
- 9 (b) Contain evidence of active participation in the development of 10 the business recruitment effort between local governments, the 11 community, and other local development organizations that serve the 12 region;
- 13 (c) Contain a description of the proposed project and how it will 14 assist the region in its business recruitment efforts; and
 - (d) Contain other information the director deems necessary.
- 16 (3) In making grants under this section, the department shall give 17 preference to applications based on the following criteria:
- 18 (a) The degree of leverage of other funds, including in-kind match, 19 committed to the project;
 - (b) The degree of community support for the proposed project; and
- 21 (c) The degree the proposed project is coordinated with existing 22 state or local business recruitment efforts.
- 23 (4) The funding of an activity under this section is not an 24 obligation of the state of Washington to provide ongoing funding in 25 future years.
- (5) The director may establish, by rule, such other requirements as the director may reasonably determine necessary and appropriate to assure that the purpose of this section is satisfied.
