- "NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. For rate years 2003 and 2004, the 5 contribution rate of each employer subject to contributions under RCW 6 50.24.010 shall include, in addition to the contribution rate under RCW 7 8 50.29.025, an insolvency surcharge of fifteen one-hundredths of one 9 percent, except that for the employers whose assigned standard industrial classification code is within major group "01," "02," or 10 "07," or is "5148," or the equivalent code in the North American 11 industry classification system code, the insolvency surcharge is one 12 13 tenth of one percent. However, the insolvency surcharge is not in effect: 14
- 15 (1) For rate year 2003, if, before January 1, 2003, federal Reed 16 act moneys are transferred to the account of this state pursuant to 17 section 903 of the social security act (42 U.S.C. Sec. 1103), as 18 amended, in an amount equal to or greater than fifteen one-hundredths 19 of one percent multiplied by the amount of total taxable payroll for 20 fiscal year 2002.

EFFECT: Deletes all provisions relating to unemployment insurance taxes except the requirement for charging training benefits to employers' experience rating accounts and for an insolvency surcharge of 0.15 percent to be in effect for 2003 (unless the state receives specified Reed Act funds) and 2004 (unless the fund

balance ratio is at least 1.70, rather than 1.40). However, for the agriculture industry the insolvency surcharge will be 0.1 percent.
