 (1) "Contractor" means any person, firm, or corporation who or
- 12 which, in the pursuit of an independent business undertakes to, or
- 13 offers to undertake, or submits a bid to, construct, alter, repair, add
- 14 to, subtract from, improve, move, wreck or demolish, for another, any
- 15 building, highway, road, railroad, excavation or other structure,
- 16 project, development, or improvement attached to real estate or to do
- 17 any part thereof including the installation of carpeting or other floor
- 18 covering, the erection of scaffolding or other structures or works in
- 19 connection therewith or who installs or repairs roofing or siding; or,
- 20 who, to do similar work upon his or her own property, employs members
- 21 of more than one trade upon a single job or project or under a single
- 22 building permit except as otherwise provided herein. "Contractor"
- 23 includes any person, firm, ((or)) corporation, or other entity covered
- 24 by this subsection, whether or not registered as required under this
- 25 chapter.
- 26 (2) "Department" means the department of labor and industries.
- 27 (3) "Director" means the director of the department of labor and
- 28 <u>industries or designated representative employed by the department.</u>
- 29 <u>(4)</u> "General contractor" means a contractor whose business
- 30 operations require the use of more than two unrelated building trades
- 31 or crafts whose work the contractor shall superintend or do in whole or
- 32 in part. "General contractor" shall not include an individual who does
- 33 all work personally without employees or other "specialty contractors"
- 34 as defined in this section. The terms "general contractor" and
- 35 "builder" are synonymous.

- 1 (((3))) (5) "Partnership" means a business formed under Title 25 2 RCW.
- 3 (6) "Registration cancellation" means a written notice from the 4 department that a contractor's action is in violation of this chapter 5 and that the contractor's registration has been revoked.
- 6 (7) "Registration suspension" means a written notice from the
 7 department that a contractor's action is a violation of this chapter
 8 and that the contractor's registration has been suspended for a
 9 specified time, or until the contractor shows evidence of compliance
 10 with this chapter.
- 11 <u>(8) "Residential homeowner" means an individual person or persons</u>
 12 owning or leasing real property:
- 13 <u>(a) Upon which one single-family residence is to be built and in</u>
 14 <u>which the owner or lessee intends to reside upon completion of any</u>
 15 <u>construction;</u> or
- 16 <u>(b) Upon which there is a single-family residence to which</u>
 17 <u>improvements are to be made and in which the owner or lessee intends to</u>
 18 reside upon completion of any construction.

"Unregistered contractor" includes contractors whose registration is expired ((\(\frac{\text{for more than}}{\text{thirty days beyond the renewal date or has been}\)), revoked, or suspended. "Unregistered contractor" does not include a contractor who has maintained a valid bond and the insurance or assigned account required by RCW 18.27.050, and whose registration has lapsed for thirty
- 30 ((5) "Department" means the department of labor and industries.
- 31 (6) "Director" means the director of the department of labor and 32 industries.
- (7)) (11) "Unsatisfied final judgment" means a judgment that has not been satisfied either through payment, court approved settlement, discharge in bankruptcy, or assignment under RCW 19.72.070.
- 36 (12) "Verification" means the receipt and duplication by the city, 37 town, or county of a contractor registration card that is current on 38 its face, checking the department's contractor registration data base, 39 or calling the department to confirm that the contractor is registered.

- 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.27.030 and 1998 c 279 s 3 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 (1) An applicant for registration as a contractor shall submit an 4 application under oath upon a form to be prescribed by the director and 5 which shall include the following information pertaining to the 6 applicant:
 - (a) Employer social security number.

- 8 (b) <u>Unified business identifier number, if required by the</u> 9 <u>department of revenue.</u>
- 10 <u>(c)</u> Evidence of workers' compensation coverage for the applicant's 11 employees working in Washington, as follows:
- 12 (i) The applicant's industrial insurance account number issued by 13 the department;
- (ii) The applicant's self-insurer number issued by the department;
 or
- (iii) For applicants domiciled in a state or province of Canada subject to an agreement entered into under RCW 51.12.120(7), as permitted by the agreement, filing a certificate of coverage issued by the agency that administers the workers' compensation law in the applicant's state or province of domicile certifying that the applicant has secured the payment of compensation under the other state's or province's workers' compensation law.
- (((c))) (d) Employment security department number.
- $((\frac{d}{d}))$ (e) State excise tax registration number.
- $((\frac{(+)}{(+)}))$ (f) Unified business identifier (UBI) account number may be substituted for the information required by $((\frac{(+)}{(+)}))$ (c) of this subsection if the applicant will not employ employees in Washington, and by $((\frac{(+)}{(+)}))$ (d) and $((\frac{(+)}{(+)}))$ (e) of this subsection.
- 29 (((f))) (g) Type of contracting activity, whether a general or a 30 specialty contractor and if the latter, the type of specialty.
- (((g))) (h) The name and address of each partner if the applicant is a firm or partnership, or the name and address of the owner if the applicant is an individual proprietorship, or the name and address of the corporate officers and statutory agent, if any, if the applicant is a corporation or the name and address of all members of other business entities. The information contained in such application is a matter of public record and open to public inspection.
- 38 (2) The department may verify the workers' compensation coverage information provided by the applicant under subsection $(1)((\frac{b}{b}))$ (c)

of this section, including but not limited to information regarding the coverage of an individual employee of the applicant. If coverage is provided under the laws of another state, the department may notify the other state that the applicant is employing employees in Washington.

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(3)(a) The department shall deny an application for registration if: (i) The applicant has been previously ((registered)) performing work subject to this chapter as a sole proprietor, partnership, ((er)) corporation, or other entity and the department has notice that the applicant has an unsatisfied final judgment against him or her in an action based on this chapter ((that was incurred during a previous registration under this chapter)) or the applicant owes the department money for penalties assessed or fees due under this chapter as a result of a final judgment; (ii) the applicant was a principal or officer of a partnership, corporation, or other entity that either has an unsatisfied final judgment against it in an action that was incurred for work performed subject to this chapter or owes the department money for penalties assessed or fees due under this chapter as a result of a final judgment; or (iii) the applicant does not have a valid unified business identifier number, if required by the department of revenue.

(b) The department shall suspend an active registration if (i) the department has notice that the registrant is a sole proprietor or a principal or officer of a registered contractor that has an unsatisfied final judgment against it for work within the scope of this chapter; or (ii) the applicant does not maintain a valid unified business identifier number, if required by the department of revenue.

26 (4) The department shall not deny an application or suspend a 27 registration because of an unsatisfied final judgment if the 28 applicant's or registrant's unsatisfied final judgment was determined 29 by the director to be the result of the fraud or negligence of another 30 party.

31 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.27.040 and 1997 c 314 s 5 are each amended to read 32 as follows:

33 (1) Each applicant shall file with the department a surety bond 34 issued by a surety insurer who meets the requirements of chapter 48.2835 RCW in the sum of ((six)) twelve thousand dollars if the applicant is 36 a general contractor and ((four)) six thousand dollars if the applicant 37 is a specialty contractor. If no valid bond is already on file with 38 the department at the time the application is filed, a bond must

accompany the registration application. The bond shall have the state of Washington named as obligee with good and sufficient surety in a form to be approved by the department. The bond shall be continuous and may be canceled by the surety upon the surety giving written notice to the director ((of its intent to cancel the bond)). A cancellation or revocation of the bond or withdrawal of the surety from the bond automatically suspends the registration issued to the registrant until a new bond or reinstatement notice has been filed and approved as provided in this section. The bond shall be conditioned that the applicant will pay all persons performing labor, including employee benefits, for the contractor, will pay all taxes and contributions due to the state of Washington, and will pay all persons furnishing labor or material or renting or supplying equipment to the contractor and will pay all amounts that may be adjudged against the contractor by reason of breach of contract including negligent or improper work in the conduct of the contracting business. A change in the name of a business or a change in the type of business entity shall not impair a bond for the purposes of this section so long as one of the original applicants for such bond maintains partial ownership in the business covered by the bond.

(2) ((Any contractor registered as of July 1, 1997, who maintains such registration in accordance with this chapter shall be in compliance with this chapter until the next annual renewal of the contractor's certificate of registration. At that time)) At the time of initial registration or renewal, the contractor shall provide a bond((, cash deposit,)) or other security deposit as required by this chapter and comply with all of the other provisions of this chapter before the department shall issue or renew the contractor's certificate of registration. Any contractor registered as of July 1, 2001, who maintains that registration in accordance with this chapter is in compliance with this chapter until the next renewal of the contractor's certificate of registration.

 (3) Any person, firm, or corporation having a claim against the contractor for any of the items referred to in this section may bring suit upon the bond or deposit in the superior court of the county in which the work was done or of any county in which jurisdiction of the contractor may be had. The surety issuing the bond shall be named as a party to any suit upon the bond. Action upon the bond or deposit ((shall be commenced by filing the summons and complaint with the clerk

of the appropriate superior court within one year from the date of 1 expiration of the certificate of registration in force at the time)) 2 3 brought by a residential homeowner for breach of contract by a party to 4 the construction contract shall be commenced by filing the summons and complaint with the clerk of the appropriate superior court within two 5 years from the date the claimed contract work was substantially 6 7 completed or abandoned. Action upon the bond or deposit brought by any 8 other authorized party shall be commenced by filing the summons and 9 complaint with the clerk of the appropriate superior court within one 10 year from the date the claimed labor was performed and benefits accrued, taxes and contributions owing the state of Washington became 11 due, materials and equipment were furnished, or the claimed contract 12 13 work was <u>substantially</u> completed or abandoned. Service of process in an action against the contractor, the contractor's bond, or the deposit 14 15 shall be exclusively by service upon the department. Three copies of 16 the summons and complaint and a fee ((of ten)) adopted by rule of not 17 <u>less than twenty</u> dollars to cover the ((handling)) costs shall be served by registered or certified mail, or other delivery service 18 19 requiring notice of receipt, upon the department at the time suit is 20 started and the department shall maintain a record, available for public inspection, of all suits so commenced. Service is not complete 21 until the department receives the ((ten-dollar)) fee and three copies 22 23 of the summons and complaint. The service shall constitute service on 24 the registrant and the surety for suit upon the bond or deposit and the 25 department shall transmit the summons and complaint or a copy thereof 26 to the registrant at the address listed in the registrant's application 27 and to the surety within ((forty-eight hours)) two days after it shall have been received. 28 29

(4) The surety upon the bond shall not be liable in an aggregate amount in excess of the amount named in the bond nor for any monetary penalty assessed pursuant to this chapter for an infraction. The liability of the surety shall not cumulate where the bond has been renewed, continued, reinstated, reissued or otherwise extended. The surety upon the bond may, upon notice to the department and the parties, tender to the clerk of the court having jurisdiction of the action an amount equal to the claims thereunder or the amount of the bond less the amount of judgments, if any, previously satisfied therefrom and to the extent of such tender the surety upon the bond shall be exonerated but if the actions commenced and pending at any one

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- 1 time exceed the amount of the bond then unimpaired, claims shall be 2 satisfied from the bond in the following order:
- 3 (a) Employee labor and claims of laborers, including employee 4 benefits;
- 5 (b) Claims for breach of contract by a party to the construction 6 contract;
 - (c) Registered or licensed subcontractors, material, and equipment;
 - (d) Taxes and contributions due the state of Washington;

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9 (e) Any court costs, interest, and attorney's fees plaintiff may be 10 entitled to recover. The surety is not liable for any amount in excess 11 of the penal limit of its bond.

12 A payment made by the surety in good faith exonerates the bond to 13 the extent of any payment made by the surety.

- 14 (5) The total amount paid from a bond or deposit required of a
 15 general contractor by this section to claimants other than residential
 16 homeowners must not exceed one-half of the bond amount. The total
 17 amount paid from a bond or deposit required of a specialty contractor
 18 by this section to claimants other than residential homeowners must not
 19 exceed one-half of the bond amount or four thousand dollars, whichever
 20 is greater.
 - (6) The prevailing party in an action filed under this section against the contractor and contractor's bond or deposit, for breach of contract by a party to a construction contract, is entitled to costs, interest, and reasonable attorneys' fees. The surety upon the bond is not liable in an aggregate amount in excess of the amount named in the bond nor for any monetary penalty assessed pursuant to this chapter for an infraction.
- (7) If a final judgment impairs the liability of the surety upon 28 the bond so furnished that there ((shall not be)) is not in effect a 29 30 bond ((undertaking)) in the full amount prescribed in this section, 31 ((the department shall suspend)) the registration of the contractor is automatically suspended until the bond liability in the required amount 32 33 unimpaired by unsatisfied judgment claims is furnished. ((If the bond 34 becomes fully impaired, a new bond must be furnished at the rates 35 prescribed by this section.
- (6)) (8) In lieu of the surety bond required by this section the contractor may file with the department a deposit consisting of cash or other security acceptable to the department.

- $((\frac{7}{1}))$ Any person having filed and served a summons and 1 2 complaint as required by this section having an unsatisfied final judgment against the registrant for any items referred to in this 3 4 section may execute upon the security held by the department by serving a certified copy of the unsatisfied final judgment by registered or 5 certified mail upon the department within one year of the date of entry 6 of such judgment. Upon the receipt of service of such certified copy 7 8 the department shall pay or order paid from the deposit, through the 9 registry of the superior court which rendered judgment, towards the 10 amount of the unsatisfied judgment. The priority of payment by the department shall be the order of receipt by the department, but the 11 12 department shall have no liability for payment in excess of the amount 13 of the deposit.
- 14 $((\frac{8}{}))$ (10) The director may require an applicant applying to 15 renew or reinstate a registration or applying for a new registration to file a bond of up to three times the normally required amount, if the 16 director determines that an applicant, or a previous registration of a 17 corporate officer, owner, or partner of a current applicant, has had in 18 19 the past five years a total of six final judgments in actions under this chapter involving a residential single-family dwelling on two or 20 more different structures. 21
- 22 <u>(11)</u> The director may adopt rules necessary for the proper 23 administration of the security.
- 24 **Sec. 4.** RCW 18.27.050 and 1987 c 303 s 1 are each amended to read 25 as follows:
- 26 (1) At the time of registration and subsequent reregistration, the 27 applicant shall furnish insurance or financial responsibility in the form of an assigned account in the amount of ((twenty)) fifty thousand 28 29 dollars for injury or damages to property, and ((fifty)) one hundred 30 thousand dollars for injury or damage including death to any one person, and ((one)) two hundred thousand dollars for injury or damage 31 32 including death to more than one person ((or financial responsibility to satisfy these amounts)). 33
- (2) ((Failure to maintain insurance or financial responsibility relative to the contractor's activities shall be cause to suspend or deny the contractor his or her or their registration.)) An expiration, cancellation, or revocation of the insurance policy or withdrawal of the insurer from the insurance policy automatically suspends the

- registration issued to the registrant until a new insurance policy or reinstatement notice has been filed and approved as provided in this section.
- 4 (3)(a) Proof of financial responsibility authorized in this section 5 may be given by providing, in the amount required by subsection (1) of this section, an assigned account acceptable to the department. 6 7 assigned account shall be held by the department to satisfy any 8 execution on a judgment issued against the contractor for damage to 9 property or injury or death to any person occurring in the contractor's 10 contracting operations, according to the provisions of the assigned account agreement. The department shall have no liability for payment 11 in excess of the amount of the assigned account. 12
- (b) The assigned account filed with the director as proof of financial responsibility shall be canceled at the expiration of three years after:
- 16 (i) The contractor's registration has expired or been revoked; or 17 (ii) The contractor has furnished proof of insurance as required by
- 18 subsection (1) of this section;
- 19 if, in either case, no legal action has been instituted against the 20 contractor or on the account at the expiration of the three-year 21 period.
- (c) If a contractor chooses to file an assigned account as 22 23 authorized in this section, the contractor shall, on any contracting project, notify each person with whom the contractor enters into a 24 25 contract or to whom the contractor submits a bid that the contractor 26 has filed an assigned account in lieu of insurance and that recovery 27 from the account for any claim against the contractor for property damage or personal injury or death occurring in the project requires 28 29 the claimant to obtain a court judgment.
- 30 **Sec. 5.** RCW 18.27.060 and 1997 c 314 s 6 and 1997 c 58 s 817 are 31 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 32 (1) A certificate of registration shall be valid for ((one)) two 33 years and shall be renewed on or before the expiration date. The 34 department shall issue to the applicant a certificate of registration 35 upon compliance with the registration requirements of this chapter.
- 36 (2) If the department approves an application, it shall issue a 37 certificate of registration to the applicant. ((The certificate shall 38 be valid for:

1 (a) One year;

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- 2 (b) Until the bond expires; or
- 3 (c) Until the insurance expires, whichever comes first. The 4 department shall place the expiration date on the certificate.
- 5 (3) A contractor may supply a short-term bond or insurance policy 6 to bring its registration period to the full one year.
 - (4))) (3) If a contractor's surety bond or other security has an unsatisfied judgment against it or is canceled, or if the contractor's insurance policy is canceled, the contractor's registration shall be automatically suspended on the effective date of the impairment or cancellation. The department shall mail notice of the suspension to the contractor's address on the certificate of registration by certified and by first class mail within ((forty-eight hours)) two days after suspension.
- $((\frac{5}{)}))$ (4) Renewal of registration is valid on the date the department receives the required fee and proof of bond and liability insurance, if sent by certified mail or other means requiring proof of delivery. The receipt or proof of delivery shall serve as the contractor's proof of renewed registration until he or she receives verification from the department.
 - ((+6+)) (5) The department shall immediately suspend the certificate of registration of a contractor who has been certified by the department of social and health services as a person who is not in compliance with a support order or a residential or visitation order as provided in RCW 74.20A.320. The certificate of registration shall not be reissued or renewed unless the person provides to the department a release from the department of social and health services stating that he or she is in compliance with the order and the person has continued to meet all other requirements for certification during the suspension.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 18.27 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) If an unregistered contractor defaults in a payment, penalty, or fine due to the department, the director or the director's designee may issue a notice of assessment certifying the amount due. The notice must be served upon the unregistered contractor by mailing the notice to the unregistered contractor by certified mail to the unregistered contractor's last known address or served in the manner prescribed for the service of a summons in a civil action.

- (2) A notice of assessment becomes final thirty days from the date 1 2 the notice was served upon the unregistered contractor unless a written request for reconsideration is filed with the department or an appeal 3 4 is filed in a court of competent jurisdiction in the manner specified in RCW 34.05.510 through 34.05.598. The request for reconsideration 5 must set forth with particularity the reason for the unregistered 6 7 The department, within thirty days after contractor's request. 8 receiving a written request for reconsideration, may modify or reverse 9 a notice of assessment, or may hold a notice of assessment in abeyance 10 pending further investigation. If a final decision of a court in favor of the department is not appealed within the time allowed by law, then 11 the amount of the unappealed assessment, or such amount of the 12 13 assessment as is found due by the final decision of the court, is 14 final.
- 15 (3) The director or the director's designee may file with the clerk of any county within the state, a warrant in the amount of the notice 16 of assessment, plus interest, penalties, and a filing fee of twenty 17 The clerk of the county in which the warrant is filed shall 18 19 immediately designate a superior court cause number for the warrant, 20 and the clerk shall cause to be entered in the judgment docket under the superior court cause number assigned to the warrant, the name of 21 the unregistered contractor mentioned in the warrant, the amount of 22 payment, penalty, fine due on it, or filing fee, and the date when the 23 24 warrant was filed. The aggregate amount of the warrant as docketed 25 shall become a lien upon the title to, and interest in, all real and 26 personal property of the unregistered contractor against whom the 27 warrant is issued, the same as a judgment in a civil case docketed in the office of the clerk. The sheriff shall proceed upon the warrant in 28 all respects and with like effect as prescribed by law with respect to 29 30 execution or other process issued against rights or property upon judgment in a court of competent jurisdiction. The warrant so docketed 31 is sufficient to support the issuance of writs of garnishment in favor 32 of the state in a manner provided by law in case of judgment, wholly or 33 34 partially unsatisfied. The clerk of the court is entitled to a filing fee which will be added to the amount of the warrant. A copy of the 35 warrant shall be mailed to the unregistered contractor within three 36 37 days of filing with the clerk.
- 38 (4) The director or the director's designee may issue to any 39 person, firm, corporation, other entity, municipal corporation,

2 of the state, a notice and order to withhold and deliver property of any kind whatsoever when he or she has reason to believe that there is 3 4 in the possession of the person, firm, corporation, other entity, municipal corporation, political subdivision of the state, public 5 corporation, or agency of the state, property that is or will become 6 7 due, owing, or belonging to an unregistered contractor upon whom a 8 notice of assessment has been served by the department for payments, 9 penalties, or fines due to the department. The effect of a notice and 10 order is continuous from the date the notice and order is first made until the liability out of which the notice and order arose is 11 satisfied or becomes unenforceable because of lapse of time. 12 13 department shall release the notice and order when the liability out of which the notice and order arose is satisfied or becomes unenforceable 14 15 by reason of lapse of time and shall notify the person against whom the notice and order was made that the notice and order has been released. 16 17 The notice and order to withhold and deliver must be served by the sheriff of the county or by the sheriff's deputy, by certified mail, 18 19 return receipt requested, or by an authorized representative of the 20 director. A person, firm, corporation, other entity, municipal corporation, political subdivision of the state, public corporation, or 21 22 agency of the state upon whom service has been made shall answer the notice within twenty days exclusive of the day of service, under oath 23 24 and in writing, and shall make true answers to the matters inquired of 25 in the notice and order. Upon service of the notice and order, if the 26 party served possesses any property that may be subject to the claim of 27 the department, the party shall promptly deliver the property to the director or the director's authorized representative. The director 28 29 shall hold the property in trust for application on the unregistered 30 contractor's indebtedness to the department, or for return without 31 interest, in accordance with a final determination of a petition for In the alternative, the party shall furnish a good and 32 33 sufficient surety bond satisfactory to the director conditioned upon 34 final determination of liability. If a party served and named in the 35 notice fails to answer the notice within the time prescribed in this section, the court may render judgment by default against the party for 36 37 the full amount claimed by the director in the notice, together with costs. If a notice is served upon an unregistered contractor and the 38 39 property subject to it is wages, the unregistered contractor may assert

- 14 the state of Washington, or any incorporated city, town, county,
- 15 township, irrigation district, reclamation district, or other municipal
- 16 or political corporation or subdivision of this state;
- 17 (2) Officers of a court when they are acting within the scope of 18 their office;
- 19 (3) Public utilities operating under the regulations of the
- 20 utilities and transportation commission in construction, maintenance,
- 21 or development work incidental to their own business;
- 22 (4) Any construction, repair, or operation incidental to the

The exemption prescribed in this subsection does not apply to a person who advertises or puts out any sign or card or other device which might indicate to the public that he or she is a contractor, or that he or she is qualified to engage in the business of contractor;
