- 5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 6 following:
- 7 "Sec. 1. RCW 77.65.010 and 1998 c 190 s 93 are each amended to 8 read as follows:
- 9 (1) Except as otherwise provided by this title, a person may not 10 engage in any of the following activities without a license or permit 11 issued by the director:
- 12 (a) Commercially fish for or take food fish or shellfish;
- (b) Deliver food fish or shellfish taken in offshore waters;
- 14 (c) Operate a charter boat or commercial fishing vessel engaged in 15 a fishery;
- 16 (d) Engage in processing or wholesaling food fish or shellfish; or
- (e) Act as a <u>fishing</u> guide ((for salmon for personal use)) in
- 18 freshwater rivers and streams, other than that part of the Columbia 19 river below the bridge at Longview.
- 20 (2) No person may engage in the activities described in subsection
- 21 (1) of this section unless the licenses or permits required by this
- 22 title are in the person's possession, and the person is the named
- 23 license holder or an alternate operator designated on the license and
- 24 the person's license is not suspended.
- 25 (3) A valid Oregon license that is equivalent to a license under
- 26 this title is valid in the concurrent waters of the Columbia river if
- 27 the state of Oregon recognizes as valid the equivalent Washington
- 28 license. The director may identify by rule what Oregon licenses are
- 29 equivalent.
- 30 (4) No license or permit is required for the production or
- 31 harvesting of private sector cultured aquatic products as defined in
- 32 RCW 15.85.020 or for the delivery, processing, or wholesaling of such
- 33 aquatic products. However, if a means of identifying such products is
- 34 required by rules adopted under RCW 15.85.060, the exemption from
- 35 licensing or permit requirements established by this subsection applies

- 1 only if the aquatic products are identified in conformance with those 2 rules.
- 3 **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.65.150 and 2000 c 107 s 36 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
 - (1) The director shall issue the charter licenses and angler permits listed in this section according to the requirements of this title. The licenses and permits and their annual fees and surcharges are:

- 17 (2) A salmon charter license designating a vessel is required to 18 operate a charter boat to take salmon, other food fish, and shellfish. 19 The director may issue a salmon charter license only to a person who 20 meets the qualifications of RCW 77.70.050.
- 21 (3) A nonsalmon charter license designating a vessel is required to 22 operate a charter boat to take food fish other than salmon and 23 shellfish. As used in this subsection, "food fish" does not include 24 salmon.
- 25 (4) "Charter boat" means a vessel from which persons may, for a 26 fee, fish for food fish, game fish, or shellfish for personal use, and that brings food fish or shellfish into state ports or brings food fish 27 or shellfish taken from state waters into United States ports. 28 director may specify by rule when a vessel is a "charter boat" within 29 this definition. "Charter boat" does not mean a vessel used by a guide 30 31 for clients fishing for food fish or game fish for personal use in freshwater rivers, streams, and lakes, other than Lake Washington or 32 that part of the Columbia River below the bridge at Longview. 33
 - (5) A charter boat licensed in Oregon may fish without a Washington charter license under the same rules as Washington charter boat operators in ocean waters within the jurisdiction of Washington state from the southern border of the state of Washington to Leadbetter

- 1 Point, as long as the Oregon vessel does not land at any Washington
- 2 port with the purpose of taking on or discharging passengers. The
- 3 provisions of this subsection shall be in effect as long as the state
- 4 of Oregon has reciprocal laws and regulations.
- 5 (6) A salmon charter license under subsection (1)(b) of this
- 6 section may be renewed if the license holder notifies the department by
- 7 May 1st of that year that he or she will not participate in the fishery
- 8 during that calendar year. The license holder must pay the one
- 9 hundred-dollar enhancement surcharge, plus a fifteen-dollar handling
- 10 charge, in order to be considered a valid renewal and eligible to renew
- 11 the license the following year.
- 12 **Sec. 3.** RCW 77.65.370 and 1998 c 190 s 98 are each amended to read
- 13 as follows:
- 14 (1) A <u>natural</u> person shall not offer or perform the services of a
- 15 professional ((salmon)) fishing guide in the taking of ((salmon)) game
- 16 fish and food fish for personal use in freshwater rivers and streams,
- 17 other than in that part of the Columbia river below the bridge at
- 18 Longview, without a professional ((salmon)) fishing guide license.
- 19 (2) Only an individual at least sixteen years of age may hold a
- 20 professional ((salmon)) fishing guide license. No individual may hold
- 21 more than one professional ((salmon)) fishing guide license. No
- 22 <u>individual may hold a professional fishing guide license unless they</u>
- 23 can demonstrate to the department's satisfaction that they have a
- 24 current first aid card and a current cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- 25 card, a Washington state business license, and adequate liability
- 26 insurance. For purposes of this subsection, "adequate liability
- 27 insurance" means general liability insurance coverage that extends to
- 28 both the guide and employees in an amount of at least three hundred
- 29 thousand dollars for occurrences of bodily injury and property damage
- 30 in any one accident.
- 31 (3) The director may specify by rule the requirements for
- 32 <u>identifying boats engaged in professional fish guiding.</u>
- 33 **Sec. 4.** RCW 77.65.440 and 2000 c 107 s 55 are each amended to read
- 34 as follows:

- 36 section according to the requirements of this title. The licenses and
- 37 their annual fees are:

- 9 **Sec. 5.** RCW 77.65.480 and 1991 sp.s. c 7 s 4 are each amended to 10 read as follows:
- 11 (1) A taxidermy license allows the holder to practice taxidermy for 12 profit. The fee for this license is one hundred eighty dollars.
- 13 (2) A fur dealer's license allows the holder to purchase, receive, 14 or resell raw furs for profit. The fee for this license is one hundred 15 eighty dollars.
- 16 (3) ((A fishing guide license allows the holder to offer or perform
 17 the services of a professional guide in the taking of game fish. The
 18 fee for this license is one hundred eighty dollars for a resident and
 19 six hundred dollars for a nonresident.
- (4)) A game farm license allows the holder to operate a game farm to acquire, breed, grow, keep, and sell wildlife under conditions prescribed by the rules adopted pursuant to this title. The fee for this license is seventy-two dollars for the first year and forty-eight dollars for each following year.
 - ((+5))) (4) A game fish stocking permit allows the holder to release game fish into the waters of the state as prescribed by rule of the commission. The fee for this permit is twenty-four dollars.
- (((6))) <u>(5)</u> A fishing or field trial permit allows the holder to promote, conduct, hold, or sponsor a fishing or field trial contest in accordance with rules of the commission. The fee for a fishing contest permit is twenty-four dollars. The fee for a field trial contest permit is twenty-four dollars.
- (((7))) (6) An anadromous game fish buyer's license allows the holder to purchase or sell steelhead trout and other anadromous game fish harvested by Indian ((fishermen)) fishers lawfully exercising fishing rights reserved by federal statute, treaty, or executive order, under conditions prescribed by rule of the director. The fee for this license is one hundred eighty dollars."

<u>EFFECT:</u> Specifies safety requirements for professional fishing guides. The safety requirements include liability insurance in the amount of at least \$300,000 for claims arising out of a single accident.
