Brief Description: Requesting the appointment of a federal multiagency contact person for Columbia River salmon and trout recovery.

Background: The Columbia River contains a number of threatened or endangered stocks of salmon or trout. A multitude of federal regulatory agencies are involved in the management of Columbia River activities that affect the recovery of salmon and trout.

The most effective way for state and local governments, tribal governments, and citizens to comply with federal laws and policies would be through establishment of a single federal contact person.

Summary of Bill: The President of the United States is requested to appoint a single contact person to represent the federal government on Columbia River salmon recovery issues. Congress is requested to fund the position.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

Testimony For: The multitude of federal agencies and programs on the Columbia River makes it difficult for citizens and agencies to determine what federal entities are saying and doing with regard to Columbia River salmon recovery.
