- 1 AN ACT Relating to restrictions on public passenger transportation
- 2 system agreements for services by private entities; adding a new
- 3 section to chapter 41.56 RCW; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 41.56 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) A public employer covered by this chapter shall not enter into
- 8 any contract or agreement whereby a private entity provides services to
- 9 a public employer, if:
- 10 (a) The services provided under the contract are of the type
- 11 typically or historically provided by public passenger transportation
- 12 system employees covered by RCW 41.56.492; and
- 13 (b) The wages, pension, sick leave, vacation time, and other
- 14 benefits to be provided to employees of the private entity are less
- 15 than those provided to public passenger transportation system employees
- 16 with the same or similar duties.
- 17 (2) Prior to entering into any contract or agreement whereby a
- 18 private entity provides services to a public employer, the public
- 19 employer shall notify all affected labor organizations of its intent to

- 1 enter into such contract or agreement, and provide the affected labor
- 2 organizations with all relevant information regarding the proposed
- 3 contract or agreement.
- 4 (3) Nothing in this section may be construed as limiting public
- 5 employers' duties to bargain with labor organizations, as provided by
- 6 this chapter.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 8 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 9 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 10 immediately.
