- 1 AN ACT Relating to department of social and health services medical
- 2 billing practices; amending RCW 74.09.200; adding new sections to
- 3 chapter 74.09 RCW; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 74.09.200 and 1979 ex.s. c 152 s 1 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 The legislature finds and declares it to be in the public interest
- 8 and for the protection of the health and welfare of the residents of
- 9 the state of Washington that a proper regulatory and inspection program
- 10 be instituted in connection with the providing of medical, dental, and
- 11 other health services to recipients of public assistance and medically
- 12 indigent persons. In order to effectively accomplish such purpose and
- 13 to assure that the recipient of such services receives such services as
- 14 are paid for by the state of Washington, the acceptance by the
- 15 recipient of such services, and by practitioners of reimbursement for
- 16 performing such services, shall authorize the secretary of the
- 17 department of social and health services or his designee, to inspect
- 18 and audit all records in connection with the providing of such
- 19 services.

- 1 However, the legislature does not intend providers' billing
- 2 practices to be evaluated under rules not clearly in place and
- 3 publicized to providers at the time the bill was prepared. The
- 4 legislature finds that the public-private partnership necessary to
- 5 provide services to recipients of public assistance and medically
- 6 <u>indigent persons will be jeopardized if there is not scrupulous fair</u>
- 7 play on the part of both parties. That fair play includes having easy
- 8 to understand billing rules applied prospectively only.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 74.09 RCW
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to authorize the state
- 12 of Washington to deny payment for a good or service, impose any
- 13 liability for excess payments made in the past under RCW 74.09.220, nor
- 14 otherwise attempt to recoup payments to health care providers through
- 15 assessment, deduction from future payments or otherwise, or in any way
- 16 penalize providers for billing practices in the absence of clear and
- 17 convincing evidence of intentional and knowing misconduct or clear
- 18 disregard for understandable and specific billing rules issued by the
- 19 department in writing to providers before the services were provided.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 74.09 RCW
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 In the absence of clear and convincing evidence of provider
- 23 negligence, if the department denies payment for a bill or attempts, in
- 24 any way, to recoup a prior payment for a good or service, the
- 25 department shall permit a health care provider to rebill the charge to
- 26 the department if there is a way to do so that would make the bill
- 27 appropriately payable under this chapter, even if in so doing it must
- 28 waive billing deadlines.
- 29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 74.09 RCW
- 30 to read as follows:
- 31 Unless specifically exempted from this section, this chapter
- 32 preempts all other law applicable to this subject matter to the
- 33 greatest extent permitted by law.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 74.09 RCW
- 35 to read as follows:

- 1 This act applies to all causes of action commenced on or after July
- 2 1, 2000. All recoupments collected in violation of this act after July
- 3 1, 2000, shall be promptly refunded to the health care providers. To
- 4 this extent, this act applies retroactively, but in all other respects
- 5 it applies prospectively.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 7 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 8 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 9 immediately.
