1 AN ACT Relating to transportation funding and appropriations;  
2 amending RCW 47.04.210 and 47.04.220; creating new sections; making  
3 appropriations; authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; and  
4 declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The transportation budget of the state  
7 is hereby adopted and, subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth,  
8 the several amounts hereinafter specified, or as much thereof as may be  
9 necessary to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby  
10 appropriated from the several accounts and funds hereinafter named to  
11 the designated state agencies and offices for employee compensation and  
12 other expenses, for capital projects, and for other specified purposes,  
13 including the payment of any final judgments arising out of such  
14 activities, for the period ending June 30, 2003.

15 (2) Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions  
16 in this subsection apply throughout this act.

17 (a) "Fiscal year 2002" or "FY 2002" means the fiscal year ending  
18 June 30, 2002.

1 (b) "Fiscal year 2003" or "FY 2003" means the fiscal year ending  
2 June 30, 2003.

3 (c) "FTE" means full-time equivalent.

4 (d) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an  
5 unappropriated status.

6 (e) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only  
7 for the specified purpose.

8 (f) "Enacted in the form passed by the legislature" means the  
9 referenced bill, as identified by a four-digit number, was:

10 (i) Enacted either with no provisions vetoed by the governor or  
11 with only ministerial or de minimus changes resulting from a partial  
12 veto; or

13 (ii) Attached in full onto another bill as an amendment and the  
14 entire bill, including the amendment, was passed by the legislature and  
15 is enacted either with no provisions vetoed by the governor or with  
16 only ministerial or de minimus changes resulting from a partial veto.

12 for that activity: The Washington traffic safety commission may  
13 oversee no more than four pilot projects implementing the use of  
14 traffic safety cameras at school zones, railroad crossings,  
15 construction zones or stoplights, and no more than one pilot project  
16 regarding the use of traffic safety cameras in residential  
17 neighborhoods, at school zones, railroad crossings, construction zones,  
18 or stoplights.

19       (1) In order to ensure adequate time in the 2001-03 biennium to  
20 evaluate the effectiveness of the pilot program, any programs  
21 authorized by the commission must be authorized by December 31, 2001.

22       (2) If the state, a county, or a city has established an authorized  
23 traffic safety camera pilot program under this section, the  
24 compensation paid to the manufacturer or vendor of the equipment used:  
25 Must be based upon the value of the equipment and services provided or  
26 rendered in support of the system; and may not be based upon a portion  
27 of the fine or civil penalty imposed or the revenue generated by the  
28 equipment.

29       (3) The traffic safety commission shall use the following  
30 guidelines to administer the program:

31       (a) Traffic safety cameras may take pictures of the vehicle and  
32 vehicle license plate only;

33       (b) The law enforcement agency of the city or county government  
34 shall plainly mark the locations where the automated traffic  
35 enforcement system is used by placing signs on street locations that

1 clearly indicate to a driver that he or she is entering a zone where  
2 traffic laws are enforced by an automated traffic enforcement system;

3 (c) Cities and counties using traffic safety cameras must provide  
4 periodic notice by mail to its citizens indicating the zones in which  
5 the traffic safety cameras will be used;

6 (d) Notices of infractions must be mailed to the registered owner  
7 of a vehicle within fourteen days of the infraction occurring;

8 (e) The owner of the vehicle is not responsible for the violation  
9 if the owner of the vehicle, within fifteen days after notification of  
10 the violation, furnishes the officials or agents of the municipality  
11 that issued the citation with:

12 (i) An affidavit made under oath, stating that the vehicle involved  
13 was, at the time, stolen or in the care, custody, or control of some  
14 person other than the registered owner; or

15 (ii) Testimony in open court under oath that the person was not the  
16 operator of the vehicle at the time of the alleged violation;

17 (f) Infractions detected through the use of traffic safety cameras  
18 are not part of the registered owner's driving record under RCW  
19 46.52.101 and 46.52.120; and

20 (g) By January 1, 2003, the traffic safety commission shall provide  
21 a report to the legislature regarding the use, public acceptance,  
22 outcomes, and other relevant issues regarding traffic safety cameras  
23 demonstrated by the pilot projects.

28 (1) \$2,823,000 of the motor vehicle account--state appropriation is  
29 provided solely for the house of representatives transportation  
30 committee.

31 (2) The house of representatives transportation committee shall  
32 conduct a study of the use of motorized scooters. The study shall, at  
33 a minimum, identify and analyze the safety issues associated with use  
34 of motorized scooters, including use by children, commuters, and the  
35 disabled. House of representatives transportation committee cochairs  
36 shall each appoint one member from their respective caucus to serve as

1 cochair of the study group. The chair of the senate transportation  
2 committee may also appoint two members from the senate transportation  
3 committee, one from each caucus, to participate in the study. The  
4 study shall be staffed by house of representatives transportation  
5 committee staff. The study group shall report back to the house of  
6 representatives transportation committee by January 1, 2002.

7 (3) The house of representatives transportation committee shall  
8 conduct a study of the effect of the weight of fire-fighting apparatus  
9 on state roadways. The study shall determine, at a minimum, the  
10 various types of fire-fighting apparatus currently in use on state  
11 roadways; the size, weight and load effect of fire-fighting apparatus  
12 that are currently in use or that potentially could be in use on the  
13 state roadways, as well as on state bridges; and the effect on public  
14 safety. The study may examine state and federal laws that affect fire-  
15 fighting apparatuses. House of representatives transportation  
16 committee cochairs shall each appoint one member from their respective  
17 caucus to serve as cochair of the study group. The study shall be  
18 staffed by house of representatives transportation committee staff.  
19 The study group will report back to the house of representatives  
20 transportation committee by January 1, 2002.

21 (4) The legislative transportation committee shall contract with an  
22 outside consulting firm to conduct a study on the preservation,  
23 replacement, or supplementation of the Eagle Harbor maintenance  
24 facility. The study must analyze: (a) The costs and benefits to  
25 preserve and maintain or relocate the facility; (b) the impact of Eagle  
26 Harbor employment on the local community and Kitsap county; and (c) a  
27 recommendation on future investment in the Eagle Harbor maintenance  
28 facility or possible alternatives. The contractor must report back to  
29 the legislature's transportation committees no later than December 10,  
30 2001.

31 (5) The legislative transportation committee, in cooperation with  
32 an areawide transportation system or systems, shall undertake an  
33 evaluation of providing locally sponsored transit services in a local  
34 community supplemental to those services provided by an areawide  
35 system. The evaluation shall address:

- 36 (a) The costs and benefits of providing such services;
- 37 (b) The impact of such service on ridership on the areawide system  
38 and on any regional systems;
- 39 (c) Funding options for supplemental services; and

1 (d) Institutional arrangements affecting the institution of  
2 supplemental services.

3 The committee shall work with the department of transportation,  
4 areawide transit providers, community officials, private businesses,  
5 labor organizations, and others as appropriate in conducting the  
6 evaluation, and in developing a pilot project if feasible. The  
7 committee shall provide an interim progress report to the legislature  
8 by January 2002. The committee shall report its findings to the  
9 legislature not later than December 1, 2002.

5 (VIN) program, no permanent Washington state patrol employee shall be  
6 displaced from employment without the opportunity to fill a vacant  
7 patrol position for which he or she has a preference and meets the  
8 minimum qualifications. For the purpose of the VIN program  
9 elimination, the guidelines under chapter 356-26 WAC (Registers-  
10 Certifications) shall be suspended for those employees holding the

13 design, right of way acquisition, or construction of state highway

17 activity:

18 (1) The special category C account--state appropriation of  
19 \$61,000,000 includes \$56,500,000 in proceeds from the sale of bonds  
20 authorized by RCW 47.10.812. The transportation commission may  
21 authorize the use of current revenues available to the department of  
22 transportation in lieu of bond proceeds for any part of the state  
23 appropriation.

24 (2) The department shall report December 1st and June 1st of each  
25 year to the transportation committees of the legislature and the office  
26 of financial management on the timing and the scope of work being  
27 performed for the regional transit authority known as sound transit.  
28 This report shall provide a description of all department activities  
29 related to the regional transit authority including investments in  
30 state-owned infrastructure.

31 (3) The motor vehicle account--federal appropriation in this  
32 section is transferrable to the multimodal transportation account to  
33 ensure efficient funds management and program delivery.

34 (4) The motor vehicle account--state appropriation includes  
35 \$378,952,000 in proceeds from the sale of bonds authorized by RCW  
36 47.10.843. The transportation commission may authorize the use of  
37 current revenues available to the department of transportation in lieu  
38 of bond proceeds for any part of the state appropriation.

1 (5) The department, in delivering the highway construction program,  
2 shall, to the extent possible, maximize the use of temporary and  
3 overtime full time equivalent positions and, where appropriate,  
4 seasonal employees. The department shall report quarterly on program  
5 delivery and related workforce adjustments.

6 (6) Savings generated from the application of new project delivery  
7 tools and efficiencies shall be reinvested into high priority  
8 construction activities. These savings shall be documented with  
9 savings from other programs and reported to the office of financial  
10 management and the transportation committees of the legislature.

11 (7) The motor vehicle account--state appropriation includes  
12 \$3,898,000 in unexpended proceeds from the January 2001 bond sale  
13 authorized in RCW 47.10.834.

14 (8) \$2,500,000 of the motor vehicle account--state appropriation is  
15 provided solely for the predesign of the northeast 44th street  
16 interchange on I-405. The amount represents one-third of the biennial  
17 cost and shall be spent equally with funds provided by the city of  
18 Renton and the developer.

35 multimodal transportation (~~((funds))~~) account. Adjustments for any  
36 indirect cost recoveries may also be made at this time.

37 (7) The department shall provide an annual report to the  
38 legislative transportation committee and the office of financial  
39 management on the expenditures and full-time equivalents processed

1 through the miscellaneous transportation programs account. The report  
2 must also include recommendations for changes to the process, if  
3 needed.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 503.** If any provision of this act or its  
5 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the  
6 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other  
7 persons or circumstances is not affected.

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 504.** This act is necessary for the immediate  
9 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
10 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect  
11 immediately.
